A WORD FROM KORY

By now, everyone should have received notification about Mike McColl's resignation. Mike will be leaving us to work with the regional camping program and with Hurstbourne Christian Church in Louisville. As he and Heather anticipate the arrival of their new son, we wish them God's blessings and a healthy, joyful future.

Mike's resignation, coupled with Cyd Cowgill's departure, probably raises a lot of questions in your mind. Let me do my best to try and address them.

What's going on?

As I understand it, this is a common occurrence during ministerial transitions. The arrival of a new senior pastor is a natural time for existing staff to evaluate their call to ministry to discern if God might have something else in store for them. Both Cyd and Mike are leaving us for exciting opportunities: Cyd to be a senior pastor and Mike to help start a youth program and to revitalize our regional camp program. Many churches that have a change in senior pastor experience this same kind of transition within the first year.

What about Colette?

I have checked and double-checked with Colette, and she assures me she has no plans to go anywhere. She and I are committed to working as a team here at Crestwood.

Are we going to replace Cyd and/or Mike?

This is a great question, and one that ultimately the congregation will answer. I am working on a vision for the Crestwood staff that includes some significant restructuring of Minister of Adult Ministries position and some shifting of responsibilities for the Minister of Children and Youth position. I'm excited to share this vision with you, but I want to wait until after Christmas because (1) I want to honor Cyd and Mike's ministry with us and not share this vision until their time with us is concluded, and (2) I don't want this important conversation to distract from the celebration of Advent and Christmas or get lost in the holiday chaos. So, shortly after the turn of the year, we'll have plenty of opportunities to talk about the future of Crestwood's staff.

What are the next steps?

We are in the process of putting together search committees, but this does not commit us to hiring ministers for those positions. It simply puts people in place if the congregation decides to move forward with the vision. The congregation will make the ultimate decision on what the ministerial staffing of Crestwood looks like and I look forward to our conversations.

What happens during the transition?

Colette and I are committed to serving Crestwood faithfully and doing our best to keep everything going. We will continue in our areas of ministry while taking on those previously done by Cyd and Mike. We will also be calling on the congregation to help us in various ways, and we appreciate all the support we know we will receive. I truly believe this will be a time of joy and unexpected blessings because, as I said Sunday, "God is in the transitions."

I am very excited to share with you my vision for Crestwood. I believe it will help us grow and move forward as a church, serving God and each other in new and exciting ways. Until I am able to share it with you, I am asking you to trust me. I love serving God and I love this congregation, and I am wholeheartedly committed to leading Crestwood into the future God has planned for us.

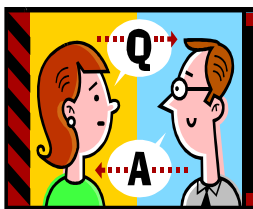

MEN'S BREAKFAST



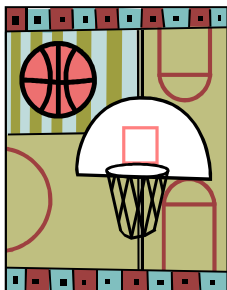
