## RE-KEYING CHURCH LOCKS

In an effort to provide more security for the church property and to be better stewards of this gift with which God has graced us, we will be re-keying the church locks and putting into place a new Key Usage Policy and tracking system.

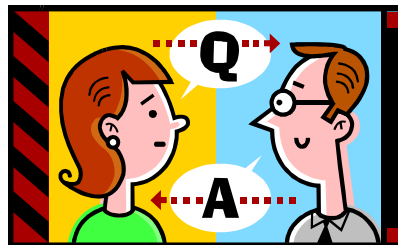


All exterior locks will be either changed or "killed" (made inaccessible from the outside). We will also do this to a few strategic interior locks. The new keys will be a type that can only be duplicated by the locksmith and only with signed permission from designated church personnel. There will be different types of keys available, depending on a person's level of need for access.

The distribution of the new keys will begin on Tuesday, July 6, with the actual change-over to the new locks during the week of July 26-30. Each person requesting a key must fill out a key request form in the Church Office and pay a refundable deposit of \$12. This will allow us to keep track of who has been issued keys. In addition, each key-holder will be given a copy of the Key Usage Policy.

Several communications to members and outside groups will be sent out prior to the change-over date. Any questions or concerns about this should be referred to the church office.

## A WORD FROM KORY...

If you came by the church office last week, you may have thought you were in the wrong building. The main office was in the process of getting revamped with new paint and carpet, so everything in the office space not nailed down was moved out into the open area in the Administration Wing. It was a massive undertaking and only happened thanks to some dedicated volunteers.

So for a week, the staff lived in chaos. Nothing was where it was supposed to be. The most common statement during the week was, "Where's the...?" I looked for my mailbox for fifteen minutes one day before realizing it was on the floor in my office! We had to drill holes, move wires, relocate big-ticket items like the copier and basically make a mess of our normally wide-open Administration Wing.

Not only that, but there was the smell. For most of the week it was paint fumes. As the painters did their work, the staff was exposed to intoxicating smell of paint. I knew we'd been working in the office too long when I had an hour-long counseling session with a rainbow-colored unicorn. And then, toward the end of the week when the carpet was installed, there was the smell of the carpet glue. For a few days we were giving gas masks to all visitors.

Once the work was finished, we were thrilled with the new space, but we still had to move all the office stuff back in from the open area. Once again a cadre of volunteers showed up this past Monday morning and in a few short hours recreated the office with a lot of hard work, patience and elbow grease. Some folks did the heavy lifting, others handled the stacking and sorting, while others simply provided encouragement and a helping hand whenever needed. The staff can't say enough words of thanks for all those people who helped put our lives back together.

Isn't that often how life goes? Things go along relatively smoothly, and then all of a sudden something comes along that throws us into chaos. Everything that was familiar becomes foreign. Nothing is where it supposed to be. Our most frequent question is, "What happened to the...?" Peace? Good health? Stability? Life makes a mess of our normally ordered lives and, to put it bluntly, it stinks.

But thankfully, we trust that God is there, even in the mess, working to bring good out of bad, order out of chaos. And isn't it true that God often works through other people? When life is at its messiest, our family, friends and church step up and help us pick up the pieces. Some do the heavy lifting, others sort and stack and still others simply sit with us, providing encouragement and a helping hand.

Give thanks to God today for all the people who love you, for those who are there when we need them most. They are nothing short of God incarnate, embodying the hands, feet and heart of Christ to help us being to clean up our messes, replacing the stink with the sweet aroma of grace and love. The staff is so thankful to be part of such a loving, giving church. Thank you, Crestwood, for reminding us daily of God's love.

## "TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALL GAME" CRESTWOOD FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE BASEBALL OUTING

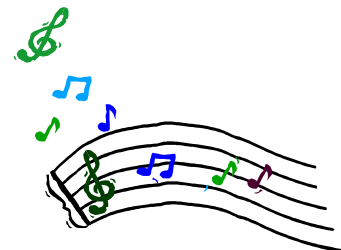
