Last November, we participated in a Deliberative Dialogue process about food insecurity in Lexington. Kory preached two sermons about the topic and in between we hosted a dialogue about how we as Crestwood could address it. The process led to some excellent

Then, on February 16 at 4:00 PM, we'll host another Deliberative Dialogue on the issue. Kory will preach a follow-up sermon on February 23 with lessons learned from the conversations.

We hope that this is an opportunity for us to explore a controversial issue with love and respect, and to find common ground in the midst of our differing opinions. We hope you'll make plans to listen to the sermons and attend the dialogue.
