A WORD FROM KORY

Questions. Seems like that's all I do these days is ask and deal with questions. Our summer sermon series is based upon questions the congregation wanted us to address. The challenges of a global pandemic and racial tension are raising serious questions about issues of health, safety, solidarity, and the future. We have an upcoming election that is generating



important questions about our country. And on a personal level, people are struggling with questions about their own lives. Am I safe? Will things ever be normal again? What's going to happen?

I don't have any answers, and that's tough for me. I'm a problem-solver, so I like to be able to answer questions. In my former life as a journalist, every question I asked had an answer if I just dug deeply enough. Ask the right people the right question and you'll eventually get an answer.

But there's no easy answer for our questions today. I don't know when things will return to normal. I don't know who's sick and who's not. I don't know how to solve the racial divide in our country. I don't know what's going to happen. I don't know about you, but that causes me a lot of anxiety. I'm a future-oriented person, so I like to know what's coming so I can plan for it. How do you plan for something so unknown, so unpredictable as our future right now?

"Do not worry," Jesus says in Matthew. Seriously? Has he seen the news? Maybe Jesus has already tested negative for COVID, so he doesn't have to worry, but the rest of us have some serious questions. I'd like to take Jesus at his word about not worrying, but sometimes when I lie down to sleep I can't shut my brain off. "Do not worry," Jesus says. "Today's problems are enough for today." But are they? It feels like today's problems are enough for a whole week!

I'm not great at trusting in God. I want to be better, but I always seem to hedge my bets. When I'm facing the unknown, I say, "Surely God won't come through THIS time!" And then God comes through and I give God all kinds of praise and glory...until the next time, when I say, "Surely God won't come through THIS time!" How in the world does God put up with us?

I don't know what tomorrow will bring. I don't know what the future holds. But I trust God is in it. That doesn't mean I can just sit back and wait for God to act. I believe part of what God has done to fix this world is send US into it! We have been given the gifts and graces and courage to make a difference, to stand against the rising tide of hatred and division, to shine God's light into this world.

So, one of the ways that helps me alleviate my worry about the future is to do my part to make it better. If you're worried, turn your focus from inward to outward and find a way to make a difference. Identify what most concerns you and put your energy into addressing it, either at the personal or systemic level. As Jesus says (I know, that guy can be so annoying), "Can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?"

I'm not saying we shouldn't worry. How can we not? But we can balance our worry with work, trusting that God has given us what we need to be the change we want to see. Things are tough out there. There are a lot of tough questions and no easy answers. But the only way to begin seeking an answer is to work towards it. Let's ask our questions together and trust God's spirit to lead us toward a greater understanding of who we are, who God is, and how trusting in God makes all the difference.

TRISH TALK

Dear Friends,

Each week when I do the benediction, I quote a version of Roman 15:13: "And now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing that you may abound in hope!" I think during these days of the pandemic and the open wounds of racism in our country, I am clinging ever more tightly to these words. I have been asked and have been asking, "How do I stay positive during these times?" I think it comes back to these words from the apostle Paul. First, God is a God of HOPE. We can have assurance that the current state of things is not the end. That God is a God of HOPE and that truth means that God is at work in the midst of all things working for good. Even in the midst of pandemics. Even when human sinfulness has lessened and even denied the humanity of others. God is a God of HOPE and that means that there is opportunity for healing and renewal. God is at work equipping those who seek to be found faithful to be ones who can abound in HOPE because of who God is. Friends, during these days, we hang on to this knowing that we can be equipped to be Kingdom builders -- we can be used by God to bring goodness out of the challenges.

We may have to stay home longer than we want. We may have to challenge our own thinking and we may have to risk isolating friends or family by speaking up for others who do not look like us. We may have to spend time reading, listening, and questioning in order to understand and to not perpetuate brokenness. We may have to change. And that is okay because the "God of HOPE can fill us with the joy and peace ..." we need for the living of these days. We cannot separate our relationship with God from the journey through these turbulent times.

So, friends, let us not lose courage. Let us hang on to HOPE! We are children of God and followers of Jesus Christ. May all that we do and say reflect love and grace.





HEALTHY CHURCH TASK FORCE MEETS

Our Healthy Church Task Force held its first meeting on June 16 to discuss issues around the potential reopening of the church. The task force, consisting of the staff and four congregation members, were in agreement not to open the church for Sunday worship until we have a much clearer sense that we can do so without jeopardizing the health of anyone involved (ministers, choir, congregation members, etc.).

The task force will continue to monitor information provided by the experts in order to make an informed decision, but based on the potential resurgence this fall, we expect it will be several months before we worship in person again. The church building will remain closed to all groups through July, and the task force will meet in July to talk about August. Groups are allowed to meet outside in the courtyard or parking lots providing they practice safe social distancing. If you have any questions or comments, please let one of the ministers know.
