A WORD FROM KORY

The creation story in Genesis is an amazing account of how God spoke this world into being. Whether it's a factual account or a creative rendering of a story, the truth we gather is that God is the creator of the cosmos, of this world, and of us. We are created in God's image and called to embody the love and grace of God to each other. As you probably know, at the end of each day, God looks over what God has created and pronounces it as "good."



There's only one thing that God says is "not good" in all of creation. Mosquitos? Brussels sprouts? Good guesses, but no. God says in Genesis 2:18, "Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.'" So God creates Eve so that Adam is not alone in this world. We were not created to be individuals; we were created to be part of a larger community.

That's one of the things that has made this pandemic so difficult. We are hardwired for connection, and yet prudence and the innate desire for self-protection has forced many of us to isolate ourselves from the rest of the world. Even as we begin to venture out again, we are unable to make the same kinds of connections as before, for fear of getting sick or infecting others. It is not good to be alone, and yet many of us are feeling that way.

That's nowhere more evident than in the church community. For many people, especially those who live alone, the church is the primary (and sometimes only) place of connection with other people. One of the reasons I look forward to hugs and handshakes on Sunday morning is the realization that those points of contact may be the only human touch a person experiences all week. When you take away the ability to be together on Sunday morning, you lose a major point of connection and exacerbate the isolation and loneliness of this pandemic.

No one feels that more acutely than your church staff. We thrive off our relationships with you all. Speaking for me, it's my favorite part of ministry! Sunday mornings are still painful for me because I'm supposed to be in the sanctuary gathering with my church family, not at home reading and drinking tea. As much as we've tried to maintain connections in other ways, it's just not the same. We miss you so much it hurts.

Starting in September, we're taking a few steps to try and reconnect us at a deeper level than just looking at faces in boxes on a screen. First, we're hoping to meet you where you are for a porch visit. If you have a safe gathering area at your home, we're glad to come and spend some time with you. Just contact any of the ministers to schedule a time for us to spend together. We believe this one-on-one connection is crucial when we can't gather as a community.

We're also going to do a weekly drive-in worship service starting September 16. You'll come to the North Parking Lot by the Mission Center a little before 7:00 PM and find a parking spot. We'll broadcast the service starting at 7:00 PM through your FM radio. We'll have prayer, scripture, a short devotional, and communion (please bring your own elements). We'll also have a Worship and Wonder story on the church lawn for the kids. While this isn't the same as meeting in the sanctuary, this does get us all back to church and in one place together. We hope you'll join us.

We will continue to look for ways for us to be back together in person in a safe and healthy manner. In the meantime, please know we miss you and are praying for you daily. If you need anything from us, we're right there, so don't hesitate to reach out. Despite how it may feel, you are not alone. God bless you!

TRISH TALK

Dear Friends,

Last week, I took vacation. The idea seemed impossible to me during a pandemic. I usually enjoy traveling but that seems unsafe these days. I needed a nature fix and I needed to be

with my family. I spent three days at Herrington Lake and four days in WV. I did not realize how much I needed the break until I unplugged. I knew it had been way too long since I was with my mom and family but I didn't realize just how much I missed them until I was in my childhood home and playing with my "grands."

Somehow that is how it is. It is when we unplug, take the break, or just take the time to be still, that we realize what we have been missing. I feel like I manage "self-care" well but during the days of pandemic, racial brokenness, political campaigns, and isolation, it is harder to do. Things are so "not normal" that just day-to-day life is more challenging and exhausting. Friends, as I talk to some of you, I know that is a shared experience. Most, if not all of us, are struggling in ways that are new to us--well new within the last six months. We are mourning the loss of the things we never thought would be an issue--inviting friends to visit, playing cards, even hugging our grandkids! It is frustrating. In our frustration we are at risk of being easily aggravated, less kind, or short-tempered. If you find yourself feeling anything like this, it is time for a break. We may not have the luxury for a vacation, but we can stop a bit, and be still. Take a deep breath. Focus on what we do know. In Psalm 46:10 we read the familiar words, "Be still and know that I am God..." In these crazy days, God is still the solid ground we need. God is at work during the storms. A quote that rings true to me: "Some days God calms the storm and some days God calms the child." In either situation, it is God that we need and seek.

So, today, take a break from the chaos as often as you need to. Focus on God. Start with the simple prayer: "God help me." And then let us go into what is next with our eyes and hearts open to encounter the help that will surely come. These are hard days. If I can lend an ear or a safely distanced visit, call. We are in this together. We are not alone. Thanks be to God!





PROPERTY UPDATE FROM YOUR PROPERTY MINISTRY TEAM

RECYCLING CHANGE

For church members (and neighbors) who have been properly recycling their paper items in our blue recycling dumpster, you might have noticed that it is no longer placed next to the trash dumpster in the south parking lot. The Property Team has been concerned about the appearance of the parking area around the dumpster and garage and has made a change concerning recycling. The paper recycling container is now located in the north parking lot next to the scout trailers.





For some time now, and especially since the pandemic began, there has been a dramatic increase in visitors to our dumpster and recycling bin. The dumpster, and regrettably the area around the dumpster, became a popular trash depository for unauthorized users, and it was often filled with house-cleaning throwaways and construction debris. There have even been days when there was no room in the dumpster for church and Childcare trash. For church use we decided to secure the dumpster with a chain. Regrettably this led to unauthorized trash simply left on the ground or being dumped in the recycling bin, which is a misuse of that container.

As a Green Chalice congregation we strive to focus on good stewardship and care of the creation. Thus, the Property Team decided to keep the recycling bin but move it away from the trash dumpster. If you have proper recycling material it is still available for that in this new location. We hope this will aid in keeping the south lot cleaner. Thank you for understanding.

GARDEN COMMITTEE

If you have not visited the Lafferty Garden recently, please make a point of looking at it the next time you are in the sanctuary. Thanks to a generous donation and considerable effort by a church family, the courtyard has been cleaned up and is completely sodded and looks wonderful. The irrigation system is functioning to keep this new grass green and growing.

In order to keep the courtyard inviting and attractive, the Property Ministry Team is seeking interested church members to volunteer to maintain the garden. Our lawn care service will keep it mowed but we are asking for help with regular weeding, trimming, fallen limb removal, planting, and other tasks to assure that this area stays welcoming, vibrant, and thriving. SCOUT PROJECT

Crestwood members will notice additional changes around the church when we are able to return. **Nathan Ainslie**, a prospective Eagle Scout with our church-sponsored Boy Scout Troop #382, provided improvements for his Eagle project to benefit the church and the congregation. handicapped ramps at our entrances have been painted with bright yellow visibility paint, which also includes a gritty component for safety traction.

This new container is located along the window wall in Chalice Hall where the American and Boy Scout flags are. If you have an old flag which needs to be discarded, please fold it and bring it to Chalice Hall and place it in the new flag box. The Scouts will make certain the disposal is handled properly.

Thank you for your generous donation of \$1,000 to Lighthouse Ministries. During this time of unprecedented challenge, we have been amazed at how God has blessed us as we continue to serve the homeless and under privileged in Lexington. During the three months ending June 30, 2020, we served 23,909 meals, an increase of over 59% over the same period in 2019. ABOUT THE FAMILY: Noella has had a difficult journey to stability. Originally from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, she had to flee her home as a refugee. "When I left Congo to go to the refugee camp, I was alone." Noella says. Her husband had passed away shortly before. "As a single woman, I wasn't sure I was going to make it in the camps. I begged God for help."

Noella is no stranger to struggle or loss. In addition to her husband's passing, Noella also lost a child and her sister before making it to a more stable life in the U.S. When she found out she was able to relocate to the U.S. for a better life, she was overwhelmed with relief and joy. "Coming to Kentucky felt like God answering my prayers."

Noella arrived in the U.S. in 2014 with her son, Keve (17) and her two daughters, Kevine (17) and Jackline (14). Noella's sister had planned to join her in the U.S., but passed away right before she was scheduled to come. Noella says it was a heart attack, brought on by PTSD. After their mother passed away, Noella's two nieces, Valance (16) and Fortunata (13), came to live with her. She is now raising them as her own and the six of them will share the home.



Being part of the Lexington Habitat Homebuyer Program is something Noella is very proud of. She knows that it will empower her to change her family's lives forever. "I'm proud of providing for my children. My goal is to attend all of my classes and buy the home my family deserves. Because of this program, I can move on from the pain and suffering that I've been through in the camps."

Noella feels very fortunate to now have a good job working in Environmental Services at UK with a schedule that allows her to spend the weekends with her children. In addition to hard work, she also values her children being involved in extracurricular activities. Her son plays football and her daughters enjoy learning life skills such as how to repair things and take care of the home. When Noella isn't working or supporting her children's hobbies, her favorite thing to do is read her Bible. The family says they are blessed to have a great church family at Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Catholic Church. The support from them means so much to her.

The family would also like to thank the sponsors, volunteers, and Lexington Habitat for this opportunity. "This is a great blessing. I will be able to give my kids a better life. May God bless all of you. I honestly don't know how to thank you enough."




RESUMES ON SEPTEMBER 13


