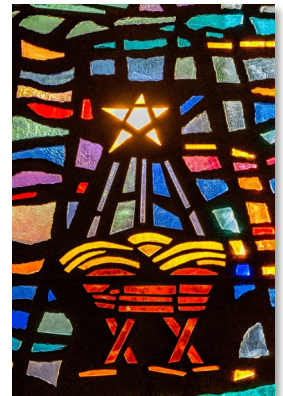

A WORD FROM KORY



I moved to Lexington in November 2009 and started working here at Crestwood on the first Sunday of Advent of that year. It was a magical season as my family and I settled into our new home, started making friends, and got to know this church which has been so special to us. We were expecting Christmas Day 2009 to be the best one we'd ever had together.

That morning, the girls (at that time 11 and 6) came excitedly downstairs to open their presents. Each got the usual assortments of clothes and toys, including one particular playset they both had been wanting. After present time, they started playing together with the playset. Within about five minutes, an argument began between the two of them. After a couple verbal warnings, which did nothing to quell the conflict, I announced, "OK, I'm taking the playset away for a few hours until you all can get along." Then, with angry tears in her eyes, my oldest daughter exclaimed, "Thanks for ruining Christmas!" I thought I was Santa, but it turns out I was the Grinch.

Many of us may feel like Christmas has been ruined this year. At the moment we are supposed to be at our most festive, the COVID virus spikes, our governor encourages restrictions on family gatherings and worship, and we are once again forced between being stuck at home or risking the health and well-being of others. Talk about a lump of coal in your stocking!

So, Christmas 2020 won't be like any other Christmas. Many of our holiday traditions will be augmented to meet the demands of our circumstances or jettisoned all together in the name of safety. No one will miss our Christmas fellowship dinner and the Kentuckians Men's Chorus concert more than me. Those and other church events were spiritual eggnog for my thirsty soul, and I need them now more than ever. But, that's not the right thing to do, so we're not going to do it.

Does that mean Christmas is ruined?

I sure hope not. If we let the joy of this season turn to lament for what we can't do, then we've totally missed the point of Christmas. Christmas is not about what we can or can't do; it's about what has been done for us. Christ's coming into this world is not affected in the least by whether or not we worship in person or gather for a church dinner. Christ has come, Christ is coming, and Christ will come again, and the only thing that can stop us from celebrating that fact is our own attitude. We can focus on what we can't do, or we can focus on what God has done for us.

At Crestwood, we're still working hard to make this season meaningful and to mark the miracle of Christ's birth. We know it's not the same as before, but we can't control that. What we can control is the spirit in which we gather together online or in our cars. We control how generous we are to those in need through our Angel Trees, Food Boxes, and Alternative Christmas Giving. We control whether or not we connect with God through devotionals, Sunday worship services, and Christmas Eve services.

This is not easy. I want to see you, to sing with you, to lead you in worship. But, this Advent and Christmas, we simply can't do that safely. So, we can lament what's been taken from us, or we can celebrate what's been given to us: a child who bears the promise that no darkness can overcome the light that has come into the world. I hope you choose to let that light shine this season, in your hearts and in the world. Don't let the darkness ruin Christmas for you. Let your light shine! There is so much for which we can be grateful to God. May the circumstances of this season help us focus on what God has done for us at Christmas. Christ is still coming, thanks be to God.

OUTREACH FOCUS

The Mission: To provide hospitality that inspires individual growth and recovery in an environment that is free of drugs, violence, and abuse, through the power of spirituality and love.

Room In The Inn was founded in 1985 in Nashville by Father Charles Strobel when he opened the doors of his parish to individuals seeking sanctuary in the church parking lot. In December 1986 four congregations committed to sheltering homeless people through March 1987. By the end of that winter, 31 congregations had joined. Today over 200 congregations from a wide variety of faith communities and over 7,000 volunteers shelter nearly 2,000 men and women each season.

Lexington's RITI program began 17 years ago in 2003 when a cease-and-desist order was issued by the LFUCG against a local church who began offering food and shelter in their basement to the homeless during the coldest nights of the winter. In response, a small delegation was formed that traveled to Nashville to learn about Room In The Inn. Today there are more than 20 congregations in the Lexington area that provide safe shelter, warm meals, and fellowship for men struggling with homelessness during the coldest months of the year.

Covid19 has changed many things in our lives and RITI is no exception. In past years, the men would be transported to a host church where they would spend the night in quarters prepared by the host church. They were served a dinner meal and breakfast, and a sack lunch would be provided upon departure the next morning. Crestwood hosted the men twice a month November - March. This procedure will not be possible this year due to the virus.

The RITI Board of Directors has determined how to continue the program in a safe manner for the men and volunteers. The 12 eligible men will be sheltered in the Guest House of First United Methodist Church located on Upper Street. Volunteers from the participating congregations will deliver meals to this location. Men have been housed here during the pandemic and continue to practice the CDC guidelines.

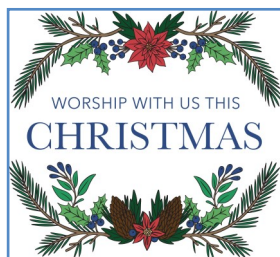

Greetings, Crestwood Family,

Thank you for choosing to adopt an Angel again this season! In doing so you are providing a child with a Christmas memory to cherish for many years, maybe even a lifetime.

This year, because of COVID-19, our process will be a little different; however, the need is greater than ever. Following is the step-by-step process for adopting your Angel(s):

Choose any Angel, or group of sibling Angels, through the sign-up link below. If you need help, please contact Peggy King at peggy@crestwoodchristian.org. When choosing your angel(s), please take note of the number associated with your choice(s) as these numbers will be used to match your gift to the correct child. If your number also has a letter beside it (101a, 101b, etc.) that means this child has siblings. Please plan to shop for all siblings in this group so that gifts are consistent within that family.

Shop for your Angel. Please remember, the gift suggestions are meant to be a guide, not a list to be fulfilled.

Package your gifts. Please do not wrap your gifts. If you wish, you may include a roll of wrapping paper and some ribbon with your gift. Place unwrapped gifts in a black trash bag (to keep little eyes from seeing gifts before Christmas). Trash bags will be available at Crestwood in case you don't have any. If you have chosen siblings or multiple Angels, please use a different bag for each child.

Contact-Free Drop off: You may drop off your gifts on Saturday, December 5, from 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM. Enter the North Parking lot, drive through the circle overhang, and pop your trunk. A volunteer will retrieve your gift(s) and get them tagged for you. Or you may bring your gifts to Crestwood Monday - Friday, from 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM, and leave them in Lollis Chapel (enter from North parking lot). Tie or fasten the bag(s) securely. A table will be set up inside with your numbered sticker(s) along with your name. Place the corresponding sticker on each bag. If you have adopted sibling Angels, please be sure to tie these bags together. **Gifts need to be at Crestwood no later than Monday, December 7 at Noon.**

Thank you so very much! You have now given a child more than a gift. You have given a child hope, joy, and a memory. And who knows where this will lead!

2021 PROPOSED BUDGET

A NOTE FROM FINANCE MINISTRY TEAM

The Finance Ministry team recommended the 2021 Proposed Budget, included below, for approval at the November 18 Administrative Board Meeting. The Administrative Board approved the proposed budget and the 2021 Proposed Budget will be presented to the congregation for approval at a congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, December 20, at 1:00 pm via Zoom.

The number of pledges for 2021 was 132 compared to 163 in 2020. Due to the lower number of pledges, approximately 23% of the budget is based upon estimates of giving for 2021 compared to 14% of estimates of giving in the 2020 budget. Thanks in part to two large pledges, we are able to recommend, and the Administrative Board approved, a balanced budget with an increase in total giving of 6.1 %. The budgets for all ministry teams, with the exceptions of Personnel, Finance, Technology, and our Outreach ministries, are at the same level as 2020. The increase in Personnel is due to the addition of the position of our Communications Intern, Griffin Allen, and increases in health insurance. There are no salary increases for church staff in 2021. The increase for Finance is due to increases in insurance premiums. The increase in Technology is due to increased fixed costs in phone and internet charges. The budget increases the total outreach giving by 30.8 % from \$116,592 in 2020 to \$152,492 .00 in 2021. The overall percentage of outreach giving increased from 13.34% in 2020 to 16.45% in 2021.

Thank you to the members of Crestwood for providing the resources to Crestwood so that the Finance ministry team was able to recommend a balanced budget to the Administrative Board which sustains and increases the work and mission of Crestwood. Thank you to the members of the Finance Ministry team for your service to Crestwood.
