A WORD FROM KORY


In January, I took my final two courses for my Doctorate of Ministry program. Could y'all hear me whooping and hollering all across Lexington? It's a been a long 2 ½ years, so it's good to have my coursework out of the way. Once I write my final papers for these classes (prayers appreciated!), I can start working on my proposal for my final project.

This journey has been enlightening for me. I love the academic setting, and while I'm not a big fan of footnotes and bibliographies, it's been a joy to stretch my brain and engage in the kind of stimulating discussions that go along with theological learning. I also appreciate that much of what I have learned has been directly applicable to my ministry at Crestwood. I hope the church is benefiting as much as I am.

The last class I took was probably the most challenging for me, both personally and professionally. It was called "Theology and Migration – Borderlands" and was taught by Dr. Emily Askew. The focus of the class was on the theological concepts that undergird the issue of immigration. While our culture wrestles with this issue on the political, social, and economic level, like any issue, there's always a deeper spiritual aspect to consider. This is certainly true with immigration.

The course was an intensive, which means a lot of reading leading up to the class, three days of synchronous learning (in this case, three three-hour Zoom sessions in three days), and then several challenging writing assignments after the class. Leading up to our sessions, we read The Far Away Brothers, a non-fiction book about underage undocumented twins from El Salvador who migrate to the United States to try and make a life, and Undocumented, a look at the evolution of immigration from Mexico and how the border "moved" in order to make such action criminal.

We also watched several interviews and documentaries to help us understand the issue more deeply. We watched an interview with a pastor in Lodi, California, who works with undocumented migrants to help them navigate the complex judicial system, and an interview with a





the border. After listening to these two brave individuals share so vulnerably, all I can say is that we white people in Lexington, Kentucky, have no idea how privileged our lives are. The fact that we can go to bed at night without worrying about the threat of gang violence or hunger forcing us from our homes is something we should never take for granted.

To be honest, I DO take that for granted. Every night. My life is so relatively easy that I can't even imagine what an immigrant must go through. Dr. Askew encouraged us to let this issue "break our hearts" so that we could enter into the pain and suffering of our brothers and sisters who have no place to call home, who must leave in order to find peace and safety in another country. But I struggled to find a connecting point with people who are migrating.

Until our last day of class. To prepare, we watched an Amazon film called "Human Flow." The movie gives a sweeping view of migrations across the world, putting a human face on the overwhelming numbers (e.g., at this moment, over 80 million people are migrating away from their homes). Several times during the movie, the filmmaker focused on children, and this is when the tears came. Each time I saw the face of a child, I imagined my own daughters being forced to flee their homes and the lengths to which I would go to protect them. Whether we think of migrants in positive or negative terms, it's important to realize that they are first and foremost human beings, just like us, doing their best to provide for their family and keep their kids safe.

Whatever you believe about the issue of immigration, that theological point that struck home for me is that everyone deserves to be treated as a human being. I hope to volunteer locally with some organizations working with immigrants to help them obtain citizenship and make a home here in Lexington. This issue of immigration, once simply a point of political conflict, now has a face for me, and I feel compelled to do my part to alleviate the suffering of my fellow human beings.

HEALTHY CHURCH UPDATE

As we work our way through winter, we are anticipating the coming of warmer weather, new life, and all the hope spring brings with it. Your church staff and Healthy Church Task Force have been hard at work determining the proper steps for the reopening of our church building and grounds and we are excited to give you an update.

The task force met in January with three doctors and a childcare center inspector to get their opinions on what we can do to gather in safe and healthy ways. They were in agreement that children and youth can safely gather in Crestwood's larger spaces, provided they follow all the necessary precautions. So, starting soon, we will be resuming some of our in-person children and youth activities (in fact, some children's and youth groups have already started meeting in person).

While the experts say we are not safe to gather for in-person worship yet, we recognize the need for us to be together on Sunday morning. While we've done our best to stay connected through screens and Zoom, nothing can replace the sacredness of the Sunday routine: getting up, getting dressed, driving to church, and worshipping together. So starting in Lent (February 21), we'll be having a drive-in worship service at 10:45 AM in our Mission Center parking lot. This service will not replace our online service, which will still be available each Sunday morning, but will provide an in-person experience for those who want one. Also at that time, we will also offer Worship and Wonder and Little Shepherds inside the Mission Center.

So, when WILL we gather in person again for Sunday morning worship? We are monitoring three sets of criteria that will help us determine when we can do so safely. Specifically, we are looking for:

- · The start of the administration of Phase 2 of the vaccine
- The reduction of the incidence rate to the orange level or below
- The elimination or easing of state-level guidelines for houses of worship

While we can't predict when we will see all three of these criteria met, we are hopeful that it happens soon. We'd love to worship together in the sanctuary on Easter Sunday! Please pray that this will happen in a way that is safe and welcoming for everyone.

We sincerely appreciate your patience and understanding as we discern the best way forward for Crestwood. This is not an easy time to lead a church and we've done our best to balance the competing needs and restrictions. We look forward to seeing you again soon in whatever form that takes. 



EMERGENCY RESPONSE ITEMS AND DELIVERIES

Many of the young single moms served by Step By Step are financially burdened. Since March 2020, Step By Step has been delivering needed

supplies to the homes of their young families on a regular basis.
