The thought of a "spiritual discipline" may conjure up images of a monk in a brown robe praying 23 hours a day or a

religious zealot living in poverty as a missionary in a third-world country. But actually, spiritual disciplines are simply ways we stay in relationship with God. They are disciplines because we have to intentionally focus on practicing them. As we do, we become closer to the people God created us to be. After all, the word "discipline" comes from the same root as "disciple." In this sermon series, we're going to look at some disciplines that we can practice every day as we go about our lives. 2020 was a challenge to our faith in many ways, so 2021 represents a fresh start as we seek to grow in our relationship with Christ. Some Pharisees from the crowd told him, "Teacher, get your disciples under control!" But he said, "If they kept quiet, the stones would do it for them, shouting praise." Luke 19:39-40
