A WORD FROM KORY



How has the pandemic changed you? As we begin to see what we hope is light at the end of this long, dark tunnel, I'm hearing people ask this question more often. As you reflect back on this past year, how are you different than you were in March 2020? What changes have you made or, more likely, what changes have been forced upon you? Here are a few I've heard or named for myself.

We're more technologically savvy. Really, how many of us had used Zoom before the pandemic hit? I had used it a couple times and thought it was a nice novelty. I had no idea I'd be spending hours each day staring at beloved church members in little boxes on my computer screen. The pandemic has forced us to learn new ways of communicating and plugging in (even though some of us STILL forget to unmute before talking). I wonder, moving forward, how many church meetings will be held in the actual church building? It's a lot easier to attend a Board meeting when you can wear your pajama bottoms.

We have different priorities. At least we do for now. The pandemic forced us to stay inside and away from the many activities that distract us and keep us busy. Many of us found that, once we were required to spend time with our family, we actually kind of like them (notice I said, "Many of us"). Others have focused more on their health, using this time to create better habits. And some of us have realized that, because of the loneliness and isolation of the pandemic, we need to spend more time with those we love. Whether or not this carries over once the pandemic ends remains to be seen.

We realize the church is more than a building. I mean, we knew this in our heads, but now we know it in practice. The church never closed, we just moved to different ways of being. The pandemic didn't stop us from worshipping, praying, and serving. But it did force us to think creatively about how we do those things, like painting and delivering crosses or live-streaming funerals. The pandemic hasn't kept us from doing anything we've done before; we just had to figure out how to do it in new ways.

We know how important Sunday morning is. When we started our Wednesday night Vespers service, I thought that would fill the need for in-person worship. But what I learned was people not only needed in-person worship, they also needed it on Sunday morning. The Sunday morning ritual of church was one of the biggest losses for people, especially those with kids. I'll be curious to see what happens with our attendance numbers once we're back in person. I expect they will go up significantly.

The pandemic has changed us in many ways, some for better, some for worse. I give thanks that God walks with us through it all, and we can trust that God's promises are good. May the lessons we learned make us better followers of Christ now and in the future.

Personal Update: *For those who don't know, I'm very happy to share with you that I'm engaged to be married to Amy Treneff, a fourth-grade teacher who lives in Charleston, SC. Amy will be moving here sometime this summer and we will be married on August 14 in Charleston. She is so excited to become part of the Crestwood family and I can't wait for you to meet her. Not only is she a great person and partner, but she has helped me deepen my faith and understanding of God. We'll have a big celebration at Crestwood after the wedding date and I look forward to introducing you to her.*

Angry, frustrated, and feeling played with, the one faced the wise one and yells, "What gives? I'm looking for a life of meaning and purpose and you are playing with me. I asked for your help and all I get is KABOOM!"

The wise one looks tenderly at the one and gently says, there is life with meaning and purpose after KABOOM."

Life after kaboom. This is truth. Life after the diagnosis, the divorce, the loss of a job, the loss of a loved one...so much will happen to disrupt our lives but as ones of faith, we can know that there is life after these events. God is at work in the midst of all things bringing forth wholeness, meaning, and purpose. Let us trust that to be truth. Let us continue to grow in our faith and faithfulness that we continue to love as we are commanded to love even when things are challenging and things don't go as we had planned. Let us trust the Holy Spirit that Jesus promises to be at work in and through us. There is Kingdom building work to be done and in that work is the meaning of our lives and the purpose for our being. There is always life after KABOOM.

REMEMBERING...

LYNN WEST

March 10, 1960 - March 8, 2021



You always knew when Lynn was coming, because you heard his keys. Because of an ankle injury, he walked with a limp, a combination of strut and stagger, which made his keys loudly jingle. You'd hear his keys and then five minutes later he

would walk in. He had keys to all the rooms in Crestwood, but in the way he lived his life, he had keys to so much more.

I'll never forget the day Lynn interviewed with us in 2014. Finding a new custodian is never easy, especially when the job offers full-time pay and benefits. People tend to come out of the woodwork to apply, whether or not they are interested or qualified. Our first three interviews were complete duds, young guys in sweatpants who couldn't complete their sentences or make eye contact. And then, in walks this older gentleman in a suit and tie – a suit and tie for a custodian's job! I asked him his first question, and he started his response with, "Well, I was looking on your website and read that..." I almost said, "Stop! You're hired." And about an hour later, we did just that. That thoroughness and commitment to excellence carried through all of Lynn's time with us.



You can tell a person's character by how they handle adversity, and Lynn's unrelenting work ethic and perseverance opened doors of opportunities for him and the church. He worked through numerous injuries and illnesses, from his ankle problems to kidney failure, never complaining or making excuses. Up until his last week, he was going to dialysis in the morning and then coming to church in the afternoon. Crestwood is a large facility, and he did his best to keep it clean and welcoming. He took his work seriously because he was not just earning a paycheck, he was serving God through Crestwood.

Lynn also knew the key to happiness in the midst of challenges. In front of his computer was a wall full of cards and pictures that Jadan drew for him. And in the very center was a piece of paper that said



three things: Jadan, me/family, church. These were Lynn's priorities. I don't think they were in order of importance, although Jadan was the most important person in his life. I believe they were a holy trinity of purpose for Lynn, the three things that kept him motivated and moving. He lived for Jadan. He lived for his family and for his health. And he lived to worship in and serve the church. And he honored those commitments to his very last day.

He is already so missed at Crestwood. We miss his smile, his warm greetings, his presence around the building. As we begin to open up more, his loss will become more palpable. I've caught myself several times saying his name as I've walked in the office. We have lost a key member of our team. But we trust that he has already been welcomed into God's kingdom, invited to lay down his keys and pick up the crown of righteousness, which he has been granted through the grace of Jesus Christ. Lynn has fought the good fight, he has kept the faith, and he has finished the race. And we are all better for it.

Thank you, Lynn, for teaching us how to live a life of purpose, how to squeeze the most out of every minute. And thank you, God, for giving us the gift of Lynn West.

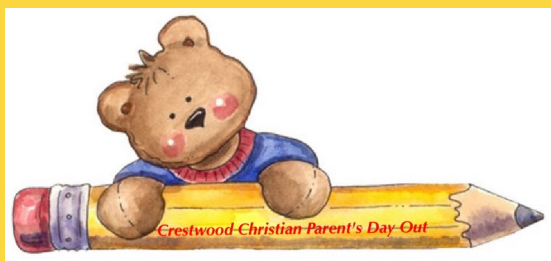

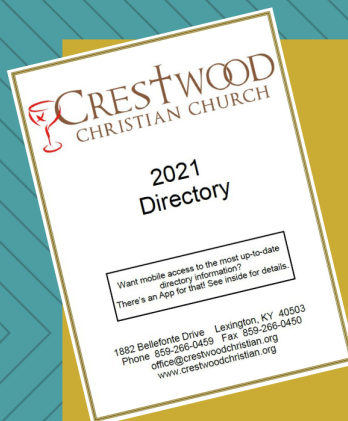

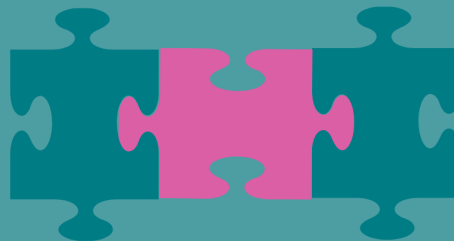

B E N E D I C T I O N

Steph is a Crestwood member and a student at Lexington Theological Seminary. One of her assignments for an Introduction to Worship class was to write an article explaining an aspect of worship.



Have you ever wondered why we have a “Benediction?”

Crestwood Christian’s worship service always concludes with a benediction. Have you ever wondered why this is included in our Order of Worship? The benediction is more than just a friendly way of dismissing the congregation at the end of the service. This is an ancient worship practice that has deeper meaning and comes directly from scripture.

In the book, *Christian Worship: 100,000 Sundays of Symbols and Rituals*, Gail Ramshaw explains that an Order of Worship, or ordo, outlines Christian worship into four main parts:

- Gathering
- Word
- Meal
- Sending

Within each part are the actual practices of worship, such as having the Call to Worship in the Gathering and The Lord’s Supper as part of the Meal. The Benediction is a liturgical practice in the Sending. Why is this?

There is a rich history behind the inclusion of a benediction, which is an announcement of God’s favor and protection, at the end of a worship service. Europeans in the seventh century included a benediction as the final part of their worship service. Christian worship leaders have been sending congregants out into the world after services with a scriptural blessing for more than 1,400 years! What a long-lived and cherished tradition!

But the practice of a benediction goes back even earlier than that.

The Benediction comes straight from the ancient biblical traditions of Israel. Kory’s benediction comes from Numbers 6: 24-26: “The Lord said to Moses, ‘Tell Aaron and his sons, “This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them: ‘The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace’” (NIV). Kory prefers to use familiar scripture each week, in the hope that people will let the words take root in their hearts, and letting the word of God, straight from Scripture, be always on our lips.

Trish also uses a scriptural benediction from Romans 15:13: “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit” (KJV). Trish says that she likes Scripture to have the last word in the service. This way, we are sent out into the world with the words of the Bible still sounding in our ears and hearts, equipping us for the week ahead.

The next time you hear those familiar words, you can think about the billions of Christians and our Jewish siblings who have been blessed by these or similar words at the end of services for thousands of years. Benedictions send us out into the world with God’s blessing upon on, to spread the good news and serve others. Thanks be to God!
