A WORD FROM KORY



For those who were able to be in worship on Sunday, you experienced what felt to me like the first “normal” worship service since last March. We greeted each other, the choir sang, the kids came down front for Children’s Time – it was worship the way God intended it! I know that not everyone is fully vaccinated and there are talks of different strains of the COVID virus still at play, but I wonder...is it safe to say we are now living in a post-pandemic world? And if it is, that begs for me a much larger question: Now what?

While the church is back to being the church again, it’s not the same as it was 15 months ago. For example, we’ve stopped taking attendance on Sunday morning because those present in the sanctuary represent only a portion of those who are worshipping with us. The church can no longer be defined by those who worship and fellowship within its walls, but must now include those who log in, click in, or Zoom in to be a part of our programs and ministries.

All the churches I know are struggling to understand their identity as they figure out what it means to be the body of Christ in this new world. For the last year and a half we’ve been in survival mode, directing all of our energies toward making sure church happens on Sunday, operating with a skeleton crew of staff and volunteers to maintain the basic functions of existing. No one had time or energy to think about what happens after the pandemic. So, now that we are hopefully there, churches are scrambling to plan for a future that is unknown. We don’t know what to expect, we only know it won’t be like it was before.

Crestwood is no different. Along with the challenges of re-opening in a safe and prudent way, we’re also welcoming new staff members in key positions and retooling our Sunday morning online presence. Normally, by this point in the summer we’d have a good handle on our fall plans and how we intend to lead this congregation forward. This summer, we’re still trying to wrap our minds around the fact that Sunday morning is happening again. Could we pause church for a month to give our minds, our bodies, and our souls a chance to take a breath and catch up?

No, we can’t. So, we are moving ahead, and now more than ever we need your help. We have big plans for the rest of the summer and fall, which hopefully will include an all-church retreat, several in-person fellowship events, and new educational opportunities to learn and grow. We also want to restart our strategic planning process, which was cut short last March by COVID. It’s going to be fascinating to ask “Who are we?” now that we are on the other side of the pandemic. I expect the answers we get will look a lot different than they did last March.

How can you help? In short, show up, in whatever capacity you are able. Show up for worship, either in person or online, as we seek to connect you to God and each other. We are planning a big “Welcome Home” celebration this fall, when we can truly celebrate being the body of Christ again. We’re not the same if you’re not a part of it. Show up to worship, to Bible studies, to ministry team meetings. We need everyone to do their part.

You can also step up. This past Sunday, we voted on our slate of leaders for 2021-2022, and there were more than a few openings. It’s hard to get back into the swing of things when life has been so disrupted, but this is a new opportunity for us to recommit our lives to Christ and our time and energy to serving. If you have an interest in serving or leading, say “Yes.” We are trying to restart the Crestwood engine and we need all cylinders firing.

Finally, you can help if you look up, which means praying. There’s no way we make it back to who God has called us to be without leaning into God’s goodness and grace. We have come through the pandemic relatively healthy, but we still need God’s guidance to take our next steps. Your prayers for this church and its leaders matter, so please ask God to shine God’s light on Crestwood. Together, we can become who God has called us to be. Thank you for being partners in this amazing journey!

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOUSE

Volunteers are needed to build our Habitat for Humanity House!

This year's Habitat for Humanity house will be located at 1152 Anderson Street. This will be the 38th house in Lexington that the Disciple Churches have helped sponsor. A family for the house will soon be chosen.

We will be allowed to have 10 daily volunteers during the first phase (6/15/21 - 7/17/21) and 6 daily volunteers during the final Phase (08/13/21 on).

Vaccinated individuals will be required to show vaccination card on the build site to be cleared to volunteer. Once cleared, no mask will be required.

Individuals who aren't vaccinated can still volunteer. Masks will be required on unvaccinated individuals.

We will be the first house to be allowed volunteers this year. Adjustments will probably be made as we go along, so please be patient.

KENTUCKY REGION WELCOMES NEW REGIONAL MINISTER



Rev. Dr. Donald K. Gillett II has been called as the new regional minister for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Kentucky. The regional board voted unanimously on Saturday, May 22, to approve the Regional Minister Search Team's recommendation that Rev. Dr. Gillett be called to this position. He will start in this position on Aug. 1.

Rev. Dr. Gillett has deep roots in the Kentucky region, having served the last 22 years as senior pastor of East Second Street Christian Church in Lexington. Since June 2017, he has been the Executive Director of the Kentucky Council of Churches and has served as an adjunct lecturer at Lexington Theological Seminary.

"After an extensive search, the team felt that Rev. Dr. Gillett was the person God was calling to this position," said Rev. Kory Wilcoxson, chair of the Regional Minister Search Team. "His relational nature, his dynamic presence, and his commitment to the health of the region will be a blessing to Kentucky as we move forward."

"I live by the passage in Ephesians," said Rev. Dr. Gillett. "The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

Reverend Dr. Gillett has four children, Jeremy, Liyah, Tasia, and Donald, III (Trey) and one grandchild, Jayda. He is married to Dr. Charisse L. Gillett, President of the Lexington Theological Seminary.
