A WORD FROM KORY



Well, this is my last Crest article as a single man! On Saturday, August 14, I will have the honor of marrying my best friend and true love, Amy Treneff, and starting our new life together. It's been a whirlwind year for us, full of road trips and daily FaceTime calls and lots of dreaming, planning, and proposing. It's hard to believe the wedding is finally here! We are so excited for Amy to move to Lexington and become a part of this wonderful church family.

I'm not the only one who's going through a lot of transition. In fact, you could argue that ALL of us are going through major transitions. Not only do we have the yearly rituals of the end of summer vacations and going back to school, but we also are still dealing with the uncertainties brought on by the continue presence of COVID in our society. With talks of mask mandates and the Delta virus still swirling around us, life continues to feel unsettled.

So, how do we proceed? Here at Crestwood, we're moving forward with our plans until we are told it is not safe or prudent to do so. While we want to be mindful of the present and potential risks, we don't want be controlled by that fear. We are choosing to plan for an exciting and faith-filled fall, and if we have to change those plans for the safety of the congregation, then we will absolutely do that, and we will ask for your grace and understanding.

Those plans include a refocus on our vision and mission statements. You may remember that we were starting this process during Lent of 2020 when everything got shut down. We preached two sermons before COVID struck. While we finished the sermon series and distributed the corresponding surveys, the results were tainted by what was going on in our world.

So we're going to try again! Starting Sept. 12, we'll be taking a closer look at our vision and mission statements. These statements were approved in 2014 by the congregation and have served us well. But we are not the same as we were in 2014, so we need to look at those statements to see where we've succeeded where we've fallen short, and how well they still apply to us.

We'll do this be preaching on each part of our vision and mission (six parts in all) and following up with surveys asking you to tell us how well we've lived out that part of the statement. Your feedback will be crucial for us to determine our efficacy in following God's call and how to discern the path forward for our congregation. The goal of this process will be to come out the other side with a greater understanding of who we are and who God is calling us to be.

This process is especially important now because our church (and all churches) has been fundamentally changed by COVID. As much as we'd like to go back to the way things used to be, that world no longer exists, so we have to figure out what it means to be the church in a COVID-influenced world. The sermons and surveys will directly address this, and again your feedback will be crucial in helping us listen to the Holy Spirit's words of wisdom and guidance for us.

I'm hopeful that we can complete this process uninterrupted. If COVID strikes again and sabotages our plans, we may conclude that it is our attempts to focus on our vision and mission that are causing the COVID problems! Seriously, I'm excited to spend this time with you digging deeper into those statements to hear what God has to say to us. I believe our best days are yet to come, and our faithfulness as a church will depend upon our willingness to be flexible and adapt to the Spirit's leading. I hope you will make your voice heard throughout this process. We need you to help us lead Crestwood forward into the future. Thank you for your commitment to serving God and each other in this and many, many other ways!

Habitat for Humanity House Fundraising

We finished Phase 1 of the construction of the house on July 17. Phase 2 was for the contractors to complete the electrical, plumbing, HVAC, and the drywall. Phase 3 is when we finish off the house. We have now been given the dates for Phase 3.

The first week of August we will be wiping down the drywall and applying the primer and finish coat of paint to the walls, interior doors, and baseboards. We will need to install the doors and window sills, and cut and install the baseboards. There will also be caulking around windows, doors and baseboards.

Most of this work will be inside the house, but we will be spread out in different rooms with the windows open. About half of the vinyl siding is finished. Habitat has 10 volunteers from Gray Construction volunteering on August 13 so we hope they can finish most of the siding. We will not be working when they are there.

Habitat is limiting the number of volunteers to 10 at any one time. So we have to coordinate the volunteers as we did in Phase 1. Volunteers do not have to wear masks if we are vaccinated. If you are not vaccinated, a mask is required. Your temperature will be taken each morning. Evidence of being vaccinated is required the first time a person volunteers (take a picture of the card on your phone).

The house is at 1152 Anderson Street.

This couple is hard-working and dedicated to creating a better life for themselves and their children. They know affordable homeownership is an important piece of that puzzle. "Becoming homeowners will be a great accomplishment," said Gerald. "We will both be very proud to have a place to call home." When asked what they would like to say to the volunteers and supporters who will help build their home they said, "We want to tell them how thankful we are. Without them this wouldn't be possible. May God bless everyone involved and may He bless them with hope and love."


