A WORD FROM KORY



I just got off the phone with Erin Cash, who oversees the Thriving Congregations initiative at Lexington Theological Seminary. A few years ago, LTS was awarded an Eli Lilly grant to study why congregations thrive. Crestwood was invited to be part of that study, and we've been in conversation with other congregations to learn from each other as we seek to grow in our faith and service to God.

The Thriving Congregations study started off well and then the pandemic hit. What it meant to "thrive" was radically changed by the circumstances caused by COVID. How do you thrive when you aren't present in the church building on a weekly basis? What does thriving look like when many of your gatherings take place virtually? How do you measure "thriving" when former criteria like Sunday morning worship attendance and weekly building usage by outside groups is no longer reliable? Erin and the folks at LTS have had to change their understanding of what it means for a church to thrive.

Is Crestwood thriving right now? As an optimist, I'd like to think so, but it's hard to provide concrete evidence to back that up. I know we're not as connected to each other as we used to be, but that's the reality of this world in which we are currently living. When only half (or less) of our congregation is physically present on Sunday morning, it's difficult to keep us connected to God and each other.

Still, I believe Crestwood continues to thrive despite the challenges we face. While our in-person attendance is understandably lower than pre-pandemic numbers, in August we averaged 147 views for the Sunday morning live-stream of our worship service. Our giving continues to be strong, and we are moving forward with fall planning. Erin asked me why I thought Crestwood was thriving despite being in the midst of such uncertain times.

For me, the answer was easy: it's you, the congregation. I continue to be impressed with how committed this congregation is to serving and worshipping God, despite the restrictions that have been placed upon us. We are thriving because this

congregation understands that the church has never closed and God has never abandoned us. We are thriving because the lay leaders of Crestwood are committed to making sure we don't lose sight of who God is calling us to be.

A great example is our outreach ministries. Our Disciples for Habitat group is getting closer to finishing another house, providing much-needed shelter and a fresh start for a deserving family. Our blessing box is being regularly stocked with food items for anyone in need. Our Local and World Outreach teams continue to meet monthly, being good stewards of your gifts by making sure those dollars are going directly to organizations that are helping to meet the most urgent needs. These are just a few examples of how Crestwood is thriving.

This fall, we are planning a full slate of programs and activities to help us fulfill our call to be God's people in this world. Through a sermon series and set of surveys, we'll be evaluating our mission and vision statements to ensure we are being faithful to God's leading. We have a number of new and ongoing adult education opportunities to help us grow in our faith, learn more about our relationship with God, and do some important self-care. Our youth and children's ministries will continue their important work of helping our youngest disciples connect with God and each other.

We hope that you'll be a part of all the things Crestwood has going on this fall. We may have to change schedules or move programs around, depending on what happens with COVID. Our first priority is the safety of our congregation, so we hope you'll understand if we have to make adjustments. But for now, we are full steam ahead on our programs and ministries for the fall, and we hope you'll join us. With God's help and the leading of the Holy Spirit, Crestwood will continue to thrive, despite all the challenges we are facing.

Dear Friends,

I hope this finds you well and staying safe during these challenging days. As you read this, I will be camping in Hot Springs, NC, as I attend the Wild Goose Festival. This is a spiritual retreat for me. The Festival is described this way: *"Wild Goose Festival is a transformational community grounded in faith-inspired social justice. Wherever we come together...we learn and grow by co-creating art, music, story, theater, and spectacle, engaging in a wide variety of robust, respectful conversations with each other and with thoughtful leaders and artists from other communities. We refuse to be enemies with anyone."* On Thursday, I will attend "Wisdom Camp: The Art of Attention in the Age of Overwhelm." My soul is ready for these days. I attended the Goose two years ago and was renewed by the music, preachers, conversations, workshops, and the time spent in nature. (I am hoping for a less liquid nature this time!) I know the Holy Spirit is always with us and always at work. I trust that to be the truth. I am praying the intentional time spent during these days will be renewing and will inspire me to bring back gifts that I can share with Crestwood.

Friends, during these days where we are weary with Covid, when the news here at home and around the world breaks our hearts and challenges our souls, I pray you too will take time to anchor yourself in the promise of the Holy Spirit. The world needs us now to be light, to be good, and to bear witness to the all encompassing love of God. It is easy for us to become myopic in our judgement of others. At least, this is true for me. I can look at another and become frustrated because they are not living as I think they should. Then Spirit reminds me: I don't know their story. I don't know what battles they are fighting or what wounds are barely scarred over. It is then, I try to turn my focus to God and ask the Spirit to give me the grace I need to bear grace to others. No matter how frustrating or overwhelming the days, we are still called to respond to God's love toward us with love toward others. These are challenging days, but the problems around us are no match for the power of God to work through us. Ask the children what we learned every night at Bible School. Ephesians 3:20-21: "Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen"

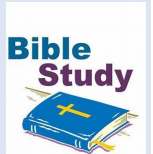


HUNGRY FOR GOD LUNCH GROUP

Habitat for Humanity House Fundraising

We finished Phase 1 of the construction of the house on July 17. Phase 2 was for the contractors to complete the electrical, plumbing, HVAC, and the drywall. Phase 3 is when we finish off the house. We have now been given the dates for Phase 3. The days we will be working are as follows:

Friday, September 10; Saturday, September 11

The first week of August we will be wiping down the drywall and applying the primer and finish coat of paint to the walls, interior doors, and baseboards. We will need to install the doors and window sills, and cut and install the baseboards. There will also be caulking around windows, doors and baseboards.

Most of this work will be inside the house, but we will be spread out in different rooms with the windows open. About half of the vinyl siding is finished. Habitat has 10 volunteers from Gray Construction volunteering on August 13 so we hope they can finish most of the siding. We will not be working when they are there.

Habitat is limiting the number of volunteers to 10 at any one time. So we have to coordinate the volunteers as we did in Phase 1. Volunteers do not have to wear masks if we are vaccinated. If you are not vaccinated, a mask is required. Your temperature will be taken each morning. Evidence of being vaccinated is required the first time a person volunteers (take a picture of the card on your phone). Hours of work will be:

Weekdays 8:30 AM - 3:30 PM; Saturdays 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM

The house is at 1152 Anderson Street. To sign up, you need to contact Glenn Means at glennm@lexhabitat.org and give him the dates you can work. Because of COVID we have to bring our own lunches, but we will have water and drinks for you. Thank you for your dedication to the completion of this home for Gerald, Martha, and their family. We are helping a family in need of affordable housing, but we also have an opportunity to give some of our time and skills for the benefit of others.
