# **TRISH TALK**

Dear Friends,

I hope this finds you well and enjoying the beginning of autumn. The beauty of creation during this season is renewing! I saw a sign that said, "Fall is a reminder that change can be good!" During this season, let us focus on the Creator and the beauty and the lessons of creation.

Last month, I attended the Wild Goose Festival. It was four days filled with workshops, lectures, sermons, worship, and lots of music. There is an eclectic offering of topics and forumstopics and presentations as diverse as the presenters. I want to share with you one of the powerful moments for me. Sunday morning, one of the speakers was Rev. Dr. James Forbes. When I saw he was listed on the program, I assumed it must be the son of the Dr. Forbes. I had met him when I was a student at LTS because the Dr. Forbes I had met would be at least 85. It was THE Dr. Forbes and he turned 87 on Labor Day. He stood before us as a man of faith with the same commanding presence that I had first encountered thirty plus years ago. His body may have aged but his passion was as strong as it has ever been. He told us he had a Divine Appointment... let that sink in. Imagine knowing that God had a mission for you...even if you are 87 years old. When God is doing the work, there is no age limit. When God is at work, there are no limitations. Dr. Forbes began to lay out his call. It is a lofty call. It is a Spirit sized call- one that a mere mortal, no matter the age, could not accomplish. And there on the stage, in front of hundreds of people, this man claimed his Devine Appointment and invited us into the Spirit's work. For now, I want to claim the reality witnessed in this moment: God is not limited by our limitations. God continues to work in and through us as long as we are open. We are the Church, the body of Jesus Christ here and now, Spirit led and fed, for the living of these days! I invite you to be in prayer to discern what work Spirit is calling you to do. Do you have a **Devine Appointment?**




# FALL WORKDAYS AT CAMP WAKON' DA-HO
