## 2021 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Dear Crestwood family,

We have completed our 2021 Stewardship Campaign, as we prepare our budget for 2022. We're excited to see how God will work through us to change lives and share the good news next year!

We'd first like to acknowledge that not everyone may have received their stewardship letter and pledge card in the mail. Lines of communication got crossed in the office and the letters went out bulk mail instead of first class. We sincerely apologize if you did not receive your letter. That is completely our fault and we feel horrible not everyone was included.

Here's some good news to share: we have 45 new givers for 2021! Those are people who gave nothing in previous years but started giving this year. In this time of reduced attendance and engagement, 45 new givers is amazing. We also had 38 pledgers increase their pledges for 2022. Despite the challenges we face as a society, Crestwood continues to reflect God's generosity in its giving.

Still, these are still uncertain times and that was reflected in our pledges for 2022. Our overall number of pledges is down from last year, meaning that our Finance Team has to make more estimates for those who have not pledged. This isn't ideal because it puts more speculation into the budget than we would like. In addition, our overall giving is down about \$87,000. Much of this is reflected in the fact that our two biggest gifts for 2021 were cut in half.

There are few places in the church budget where numbers can be adjusted for shortfalls, the two biggest being Personnel and Outreach. We are committed to maintaining Outreach as a core value and make sure our staff is properly compensated. But when pledging falls short, we have to make up the difference somewhere.

There are a few things you can do to help:

1 - If you have not pledged yet, please email your pledge amount to [financialsecretary@crestwoodchristian.org](mailto:financialsecretary@crestwoodchristian.org). The more pledges we have in hand, the less we have to estimate.

2 - If you've never pledged, consider making one. The pledge is not binding in any way, but it does give us a sense of what to expect for 2022, and it shows your tangible commitment to God's work through Crestwood.

3 - If you pledged, consider increasing your pledge. We want our Outreach giving to remain at a high level, as in previous years, and your pledge will help us do that.

The Finance Team will present the final budget to the Administrative Board on Nov. 17 for approval. It will then go to the congregation in December. Any new pledges or changes to pledges should be received by Nov. 9. Thank you, Crestwood, for the many ways you support our congregation's mission. Let's make 2022 our best ever!



## A WORD FROM KORY...

Well, another chapter in the book titled, "This Wasn't How It Was Supposed to Happen..."

It started as a minor headache and cough on Monday morning, right before staff meeting. Amy and I left later that day for a spiritual retreat in Edmondson County. By that evening, I was feeling worse, so decided to get a COVID test first thing in the morning. Both that test and a flu test were negative, so I proceeded through the week as if I had a nasty cold, including doing a two-mile hike through Mammoth Cave.

When we got back to town Friday, I was still feeling badly, so I took a home COVID test. You're probably thinking, "Surely your earlier test wasn't a false negative?" Well, it was, and please don't call me "Shirley." I went to the UK test site for confirmation and got it. Despite two vaccines and surviving a year and a half without getting it, I now had COVID (and, we found out a few days later, so did Amy).

It's been a rough go. I know the virus hits everyone differently, but for me, this was more than just a cold or flu. I had almost every symptom except difficulty breathing and loss of taste (which was ironic, because the last thing I wanted to do was eat). High fevers, chills, body aches, loss of smell, inability to throw a decent curveball, consistently burning toast...you name it, I had it.

Thankfully, on Monday morning (a week after the symptoms started), I was able to receive the antibody treatment. Not wanting to bow out quietly, COVID threw a couple more fever bombs at me, but I woke up Tuesday morning without a normal temperature for the first time in days. As I write this, I'm on day 10 and will be officially released for quarantine tomorrow. Yay! But my body is far from recovered. This morning, I took care of the chickens, made breakfast, and then slept for two hours. This virus is no joke. Amy is also continuing to make progress. Thankfully, her case wasn't as severe.

We want to thank everyone for the cards, texts, emails, prayers, and overall support you've given us. It has meant the world to us to know that we have such a loving and caring church family. I give big thanks to Trish,

Steph, Brianna, and all our staff and volunteers who have picked up the slack for me. I'm blessed to work with some amazing people.

This was not what was supposed to happen. I was supposed to enjoy a relaxing spiritual retreat, a time to recharge my batteries and get ready for the rest of fall and a busy and exciting Advent season. Amy and I were supposed to enjoy the first few months of our marriage without fevers and quarantines. Crestwood was supposed to have an amazing fall, when everyone would feel safe to come back to church and we would feel like a family again. That's what was supposed to happen.

Well, I'm giving up on what was supposed to happen. I'm giving up on the hope that things will go back to how I want them to be. I'm giving up on the fallacy that life is predictable and COVID only happens to other people. I'm giving up on assuming I know what's going to happen. But I'm NOT giving up on God, God's goodness, God's promises. God never promised things would go the way I wanted them to go, but God did promise to be with me, no matter what happened. And because of that, I have hope in spite of all that has happened.

On another page in this Crest, you'll read about our budget shortfall for 2022. Another thing that wasn't supposed to happen. But I know this congregation, and I know that God is at work through each and every one of you. I have received your support and felt your prayers. God's spirit is POWERFUL in you, Crestwood! If COVID can't stop us from doing God's good work in this world, a little shortfall doesn't stand a chance. Crestwood, I'm asking you to step and show how the hope we have in God's promises will carry us into 2022 with renewed energy and excitement to be God's people in this world. God has given us such hope; now, let's be that hope for others! I'll be back soon and I can't wait to continue serving God with you!
