A WORD FROM KORY...

Remember the song “Henry the 8th” by Herman’s Hermits? After the first verse, lead singer Peter Noone says, “Second verse, same as the first!” I wonder if we

could say the same thing moving into 2022. While we all hold out hope for a change in this new year, 2022 is already beginning to feel like 2021 warmed over. I don’t know about you, but I’ve stopped wondering when this will ever end and started figuring out how to live with Covid as a part of our cultural landscape.

It’s a far cry from how I started my Crest article in January 2021, when I said, “Well, I don’t know if I’ve ever been so excited and relieved for a new year to arrive as I am for this one! While some of the challenges of 2020 will carry over into the new year, 2021 brings with it the hope of a vaccine, a return to some form of normalcy, and the joy of a year full of potential. See ya, 2020! Don’t let the door hit you on the way out.” What I didn’t anticipate were more Covid variants, the devastating loss of staff members, and the continued state of concern that grips our country.

And yet...God is still present and active. That’s what we believe, right? Even in the midst of the most challenging circumstances, God is at work. It’s the promise of Romans 8:28: “We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.” As I interpret this verse, our job is to continue loving God and living out our calling, and God will continue working for good.

We see that at Crestwood all the time. While 2022 is already presenting its challenges, I also believe this new year holds new opportunities for us to fulfill our vision to connect people to God and each other. Crestwood is a healthy, active congregation, and we are blessed beyond measure, especially compared to other churches that are feeling the weight of loss that Covid has brought. While there is much we cannot do, let us celebrate the things we still CAN do as a church family.

For example, we can still worship together every Sunday. It’s not the same as it used to be, because now we have three worshipping communities – our 8:30 AM worshippers, our 10:45 AM worshippers, and our online worshippers. While some might see that as division, I choose to see it as multiplication. We are able to sustain our commitment to community while welcoming into worship people who are either physically unable to join us in person or who are worshipping with us from other geographic locations (the online service averages about 120 views each week). At least once a week I hear from someone who is so grateful that we offer an online option for worship.

In addition, we can still gather together to learn and grow in our faith. Our Sunday school classes continue to meet each Sunday, and we offer multiple opportunities throughout the week for you to connect with each other and get closer to God. Bible studies, women’s groups, lunch gatherings – almost every day provides another way for us to nurture our faith and our community.

And, of course, our commitment to outreach has never slowed down. This Christmas season was unprecedented in the number of people’s lives we impacted (see page 8 for more details). In my 12 years here, I’ve never seen more people involved in providing gifts, food, and money in response to need, both ongoing (chronic food insecurity) and urgent (tornado relief). The need will not go away in 2022 and neither will Crestwood’s commitment to outreach.

So, while there are challenges heading into this new year, Crestwood is poised to meet them and turn them into opportunities to shine God’s light in this world. I hope you are as excited as I am about what God has planned for us in 2022. As always, I’m honored and humbled to serve this amazing congregation!
