## A WORD FROM KORY...

The term “sabbatical” has as its root the word “sabbath,” which has a deeply biblical meaning. A sabbath is a time of rest and renewal, first established by God at the end of the creation story and solidified as one of the Ten Commandments (and the one we most often break). God ordains that we need rest in order to be God’s people in this world, loving and serving others.

A sabbatical carries with it those same principles. Here at Crestwood, we allow our ministers to take a three-month sabbatical every six years. That sabbatical time is not just an extended vacation. It is meant to be a time of rest and renewal, a time of recalibration and growth. And the sabbatical is meant to benefit all involved. As our Personnel Policy states, “Sabbatical leaves are intended for the mutual benefit and growth of both the minister and the congregation.”

In 2016, I took my first sabbatical at Crestwood. I was fortunate to receive a grant from the Eli Lily Foundation, which allowed my family and I to do some traveling. While I was gone, the congregation participated in Bible studies and heard from guest preachers. The overall theme of my sabbatical was about learning how to build a long-term pastorate.

Well, it must have worked, because six years later, I’m still here! And I’m also eligible once again for a sabbatical. Ironically, so is Trish! She started just a few months before my last sabbatical, so we both are eligible for sabbatical in 2022. I was more than happy to defer to her and let her go this year, but she is planning on applying for the same Lily grant I received. If she gets it, she wouldn’t be able to use the funds until 2023. So, I’m taking my sabbatical this year and she will take hers next year.

The focus of my sabbatical will be much different this time around. Last time, I had a LOT of fun spending someone else’s money to travel to places like Alaska and Europe. This time, I have another goal in mind: to write my Doctor of Ministry project. I plan to

use the three months of my sabbatical to work on (and hopefully complete!) that project, the final piece I need to graduate. Amy and I still plan on doing some traveling, but the bulk of my time will be spent writing.

I don’t have an exact starting date for the sabbatical because I want my time away to incorporate moving Molly to college. That will most likely happen in mid- to late-August, so I will be starting my sabbatical in mid- to late-May. Once she decides where she’s going and we learn more about the timing of moving her, I’ll have a better sense of the exact dates for my time away.

While I’m gone, Trish and Stephanie will handle the ministerial responsibilities. I expect that the two of them will also call on the Elders to help as needed. It feels so comforting for me to know you all are in such good hands while I am away. This will allow me to truly relax and refresh, knowing the people I love so much are being loved on so well.

You won’t be surprised to hear these last six years have been tough, especially the last two. Between the numerous staffing changes we’ve dealt with, a pandemic that has truly changed the game, and my own personal transitions, ministry has been a challenge. But serving this congregation is such a blessing, and the tough times have been more than balanced out by the love and support of my church family. Thank you all for the ways you have carried me through the last six years.

I’m excited to start my sabbatical and work on my final project. It will be nice to be able to focus on that without the daily responsibilities of ministry. I’m also looking forward to that time with Amy and my girls. I know God has big plans for me during my sabbatical, and I trust God has big plans for you during that time, as well. I can’t wait to see what God has in store for us!

But they are not the end, they are to inform us for living the gospel. The last words of the reading smacked me: “GET ON WITH IT.” May it be so...

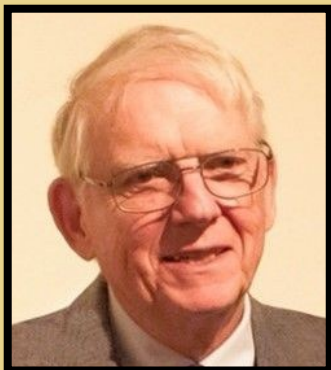

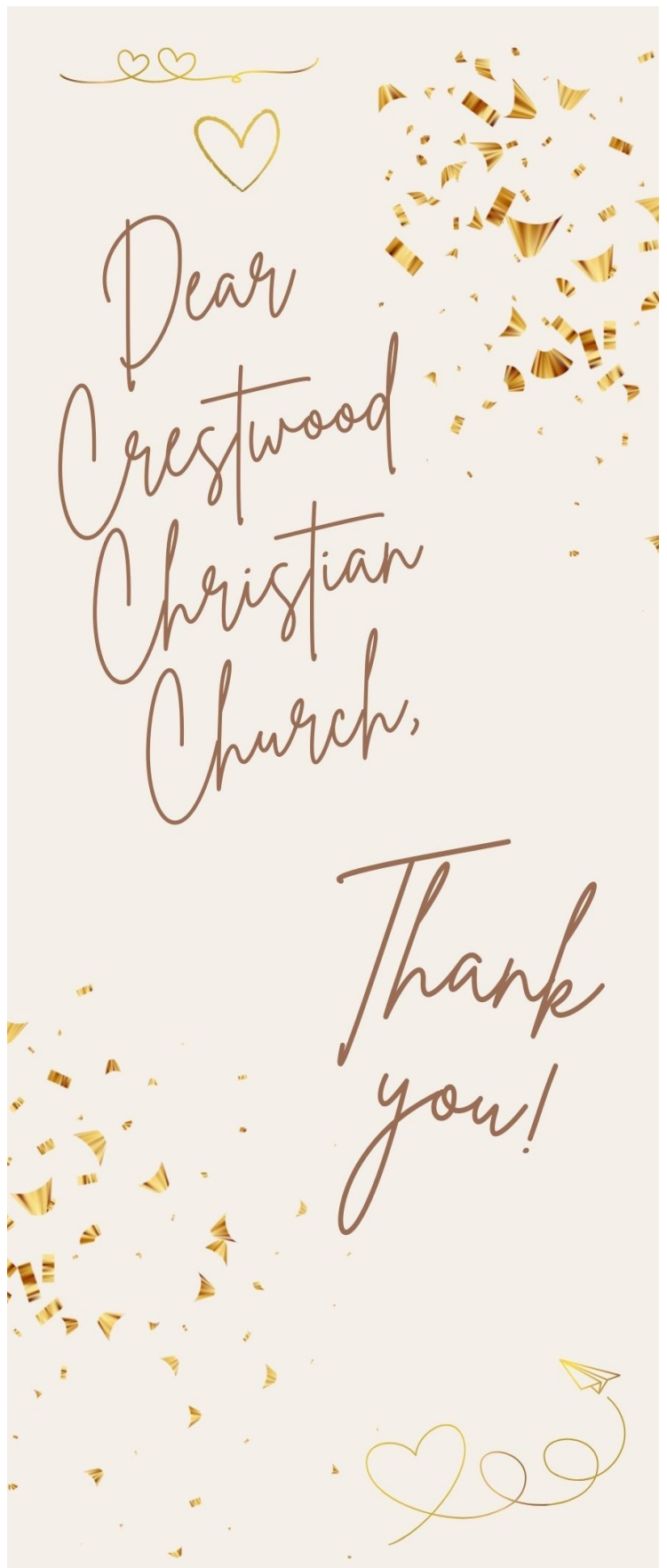
