A WORD FROM KORY...

After almost two years of having the Coronavirus dominate our conversations and dictate our lives, it feels weird to think we might be coming to the end of the pandemic. That doesn't

mean Covid will ever go away, but it does mean we're close to moving into the endemic phase, in which the virus becomes something we learn to live with rather than something to be afraid of.

It's hard to remember what the world was like before masks, hand sanitizer, and social distancing. I remember in January 2021 I was driving to Nashville to deliver tornado relief supplies and visit with a friend. She asked if I could pick up some Clorox wipes and hand sanitizer on my way because Nashville had just reported their first case of the Coronavirus. Now, those items have become a part of our cultural lexicon and everyday supplies.

But, as positivity rates continue to drop, I'm hopeful that we are closer to returning to what feels like normal. While a lot of places in our community have gone to a "mask-optional" policy, here at Crestwood, we've continued to strongly encourage masks to promote the safety of our congregation, especially those among us who haven't been vaccinated (like our kids in the Children's Wing). I can't thank you all enough for the ways you have complied with requests and done your part to keep everyone safe.

Now, we can start talking about what happens at Crestwood after the pandemic. The Healthy Church Task Force has continued to monitor the information coming from the CDC and the state health department. As the positivity rate has decreased, we've discussed what must happen for us to change our policy on mask-wearing. We decided this week that when the positivity rate gets to 5%, we will be implementing a "mask-optional" policy. Everyone will have the choice whether or not to wear a mask based on their own personal feelings and preferences.

This comes with a couple caveats. First, we will still strongly encourage masks for those who are not vaccinated. Also, if you feel sick or are having any Covid-related symptoms, we would ask that you stay home until you feel healthy. This is not just a church policy, it's common sense! And third, until all of our children have the opportunity to be vaccinated, we will still require masks for all staff and volunteers working in our Children's Wing. We are also exploring the return to fellowship events with food being served. I miss our potlucks!

In this new world, there will be members of our community who will still be wearing masks, and we encourage them to do so. The last thing I would want is for anyone to feel judged because they choose to wear a mask – or choose not to do so. We all should feel free to do what makes us feel safest and most comfortable. I look forward to seeing smiling faces, with and without masks on.

I feel a bit gun-shy talking about post-pandemic life, because we have been burned before. But with no threatening variant on the horizon and numbers going down across the board, it feels safe to say we are coming out the other side of this two-year nightmare. We're still very much learning what the world looks like and what it means to be church. Some things that started during the pandemic, like online participation in church activities, is now a part of life. What does it mean to be a community that comes together literally and virtually? How do we maintain our connection to God and each other when we're not all in the same place at the same time and in the same way? God still has a lot to teach us moving forward. Our goal is to listen to God, to follow the Spirit's leading, and to trust that we are all doing our best to be the church in this new world. I'm honored to make this journey with you!

TRISH TALK

Dear Friends,

Lent. Again. Or as one person asked, “have we really left Lent of 2020?”

Lately, I have spent a fair amount of time thinking about sin. I confess that this is not something that I do

on a regular basis. This language is not something I use or am comfortable with. I usually relegate sin to the big things that someone else does or systemic issues. Doing this denies me the opportunity for me to fully experience the love and grace of Jesus. Keeping sin as the big “S” SIN keeps me from examining and claiming my need for healing. Sin is real. I (and I bet you) do it every day. Sometimes mindfully and sometimes absent mindfully. Sometimes by what we do and sometime by what we don’t do. Sins of commission. Sins of omission. But it is sin none the less.

So, let’s use this season for introspection, honest reflection, and be willing to take the long hard look at our lives and confront the brokenness within us. In scripture there is a long list of sin and most of the list looks like sin – thieves, greedy, swindlers for examples. But what about the sins of things like careless words spoken that wound another? What about sin of lessening the worth of another because we don’t understand them or have not walked the path they have had to walk. I am convinced that taking the time to wrestle with this will only help us in our relationship with Jesus Christ. We need to need Jesus. For when we confront the darkness we cause, then we can get a glimpse of the Light. When we allow the brokenness in us to come into view then God can use this to bring forth new life. We are not perfect. We are never expected to be. But we are disciples-students-who are called to learn. We are equipped to grow. And we are loved by God through every second of the journey.

Blessings for a Lent that leads you to uncomfortable places and raw spots in your spirit. For then friends, Easter will be so glorious.

CENTER FOR WOMEN, CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Crestwood has long been a great supporter of The Nest and members may be interested in some initiatives now underway to improve service to families in need.

Staff members at The Nest will soon be initiating volunteer orientation sessions for folks who are interested in helping with some of the day-to-day needs of the organization. This approach to orientation/training will enable volunteers to come as they please and give their time and energy, rather than just helping out with special events.

With the help of some college interns, The Nest staff involved in the Family Assistance program is working to get more focus on and support for new mothers and their young infants, especially those born prematurely. They have a great need for toys, appropriate for ages 2 - 7, in particular, for the children of new refugee families to help provide entertainment and joy while children get settled into their new homes.

Most of the time even school aged-children will be at home for several weeks before they begin schooling here, and often these families come to the country with almost nothing in the way of toys or personal belongings.

Toys do not have to be new - gently used toys are very much appreciated too!
