HOPE MOBILE LUNCH PACKING

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 24 @ 12:30

We will meet in Chalice Hall to make sandwiches and pack lunch bags. All are invited to join in this way of helping the homeless and hungry of Lexington. Supplies will be provided.

The Mobile Outreach Team includes a nurse and two case managers. It operates from a custom motor home (the Hope Mobile) parked at a different downtown church location each weekday. Here, homeless men, women and children are able to find the help and hope that they need to get back on their feet.

This aggressive outreach program meets homeless people where they are and assists them with basic needs including food, clothing and healthcare. It also provides referrals for shelter, counseling and job training at the Hope Center and other agencies.
