Investing in Hope



A WORD FROM KORY...

I had lunch with a minister friend recently, during which we recounted the last few years at our respective churches. We both were amazed at how many things that we used to take for granted had changed in the

last three years. Aspects of life we assumed would always be the same were upended in drastic ways, and many of them have not returned to "normal" (and never will). And yet, as we acknowledged how different it is to lead a church now than it was in 2019, we also celebrated the fact that the church is still the church.

That means we still embody the love of God and the grace of Jesus Christ to a hurting world, regardless of the circumstances in which we find ourselves. During times of challenge (like the last few years), our human instinct is to turn inward, to hunker down, to do what we have to do to protect ourselves and those we love. And yet, as I referenced in a recent sermon, Jesus calls us, not to save our lives, but to lose them for his sake. Rather than turning inward, we are called to turn outward, to follow Christ's lead in showing love and spreading the good news that God is here, right here, right now.

That's a message our world needs to hear because so many people feel forgotten. The pandemic increased people's sense of loneliness, isolation, and lack of purpose. Do I still matter? Do people still see me? Does God still care? These are questions that are being asked in hundreds of ways in our society, and acts of violence, greed, and prejudice that dominate the news are often perpetrated by hurting people who only know how to react by hurting others. There has to be a better way.

And there is! At least, that's what we believe as followers of Christ. No matter how dark or bleak the world seems, we are told in John's gospel that God so loved the world – this broken, violent, divided world – that God sent Jesus to us. Each Sunday, when we take communion together, we proclaim that Christ is still here, alive and active, working to bring about the redemption and reconciliation that he promised us in the Bible. As Christ's followers, we have a role to play in healing our world. We can't just come to the table and keep God's promises to ourselves; we are called to go from the table into the world, living out what we have received. We honor God when we demonstrate in tangible ways that we know God's promises are real, and that those promises are meant for everyone. We don't control who gets the blessing, we are simply conduits of it.

We help bestow that blessing each time we take some of what we have and share it with others. Our lives are overflowing with gifts from God – love, forgiveness, grace, wisdom, reconciliation. Each time you say, "I'm sorry," you are sharing God's blessing. Each time you extend a helping hand, you are sharing God's blessing. Each time you let someone know they matter to you, you are sharing God's blessing. God's gifts to us are for sharing, not hoarding.

And, in my mind, the greatest gift we have to offer right now is hope. Our stewardship campaign this fall is "Investing in Hope," which means we are trusting that what we give to God is used to offer hope to those who question whether or not they have value in God's eyes. Every gift matters.

Your giving helps us open the doors to Alcoholics Anonymous and Parkinson's support groups. Your giving provides salaries for staff who are teaching our children and youth the wide-open love of Jesus. Your giving is channeled through the church directly to local organizations that are providing tangible hope – in the form of food, clothing, and shelter – to those the world has forgotten. Your financial pledge is about more than "doing your part" as a member of Christ. Your gift provides hope.

The church's bottom line is not dollars earned or items sold. It is lives changed. When we open our doors to people looking for resurrection, we say to them they matter. When a youth and an elderly person sit down for a meal together, they are honoring the image of God in each other. When you come to worship on Sunday, you are giving priority to God, not the other things clamoring for your attention. Now, more than ever, we need you, Crestwood. Invest in hope by supporting God's work through our church family. Through all we've faced together, the church is still the church. Let's not only say that, let's live it!

SUCCESSFUL MISSION BUILDING TRIP TO WESTERN KENTUCKY

Lexington Disciple church members volunteered in a successful mission building trip to Western Kentucky 9/11/22 - 9/16/22. The trip's purpose was to help rebuild after the tornadoes of 12/10/21. God blessed us with a perfect week of weather to accomplish our mission. Crestwood and its World Outreach Committee helped sponsor the trip. Crestwood's volunteers were LaVece Hughes, John Brown, and Steve Seithers. Becky Ewalt Tossey, a former Crestwood member, who lives in Cincinnati, also volunteered. We stayed at a very nice church, the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Madisonville.

Under the leadership of the Fuller Disaster Rebuilders we were able to continue the building of a new house in Barnsley, KY, and two new houses in Dawson Springs, KY. We built wooden porch decks, interior walls, and drywall nailers. We installed a front door and two windows, and started the construction of a tornado safe room. We also installed Hardie Board cement siding, soffit,

metal wrap, and started painting one house UK Blue! The home owners were very appreciative of our efforts.

It will take several years to completely rebuild Western Kentucky. But thanks to Crestwood and volunteers we are making a start!

OCTOBER SERVICE PROJECT: ARBOR YOUTH SERVICES

Arbor Youth Services is the only emergency shelter for unaccompanied youth under 18 in central Kentucky. It provides a supportive environment to youth who have suffered abuse, abandonment, or who have been victimized. Youth may request shelter themselves or they may be referred by a teacher, law enforcement personnel, counselors or other professionals. There is also an outreach program that assists those ages 18-24 who are at risk of violence or exploitation. Receiving timely intervention from Arbor Youth Services helps to place these young people on the path to safety where they can focus on recovery, job training, and skill development for those who are older.

The following items are needed and may be placed in the Giving Lane (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing), under the sign for <u>Disciples Women's Ministries</u>:

-Hygiene supplies such as deodorant, body wash
-Individually wrapped snacks such as granola bars
-New towels and washcloths
-Socks, and underwear (adult sizes M, L, XL, XXL)
-Laundry detergent
-Paper towels and toilet paper
-Gift cards for grocery, fast food, and fuel
-Art supplies
-Non-perishable food items
-Activity based gift cards such as movie theater, Malibu Jacks
-Bus passes, single ride for 30 days
