September Spotlight on Service: Lexington Rescue Mission

HOPE is on the menu. That's right, HOPE!

Lexington Rescue Mission has been in existence since 2000. It was founded by Jim and Becky Connell who wanted to start a ministry to help the poor and homeless. In November of 2021, the mission offered a Thanksgiving meal at Broadway Christian Church where those in attendance could receive not only a nourishing meal, but clothing, financial assistance, bible studies and chapel services. Over the years, the mission has grown to include helping the people it serves find employment, substance abuse treatment, and simply rebuilding broken lives on the foundation of Jesus Christ.

Today Lexington Rescue Mission provides community meals from 9:00 -10:00 AM and 12:00-1:00 PM Monday through Saturday at its location 444 Glen Arvin Avenue. These meals are served with a hearty side of HOPE. For many who come to the mission they find HOPE along with food. HOPE to get them back on their feet to help them find that everlasting job, HOPE to find a place to live and HOPE to overcome addiction if needed. Lexington Rescue Mission provides HOPE for those it serves to return to a life where they can become a self- sufficient and contributing member of our community.



This month Crestwood's service project is the Lexington Rescue Mission. The following items are needed and may be placed in the Giving Lane (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing):

- Full size body wash, shampoo and conditioner
- Deodorant, razors, shaving cream
- Sanitizing wipes, soap
- Laundry detergent, dish detergent

- Walmart and fuel gift cards
