As you go to the grocery, please consider picking up and item or two each week and dropping it by our collection point in the children's wing. We will be collecting through December 4.

#### Items needed:

Cans or pouches of meat (chicken, tuna, etc.)
Canned vegetables/fruit cups
Spaghetti/pasta sauce (no glass)
Beans/rice/lentils
Peanut butter/jelly
Mac-n-cheese/ramen
Cereal/granola bars
Goldfish crackers
Toilet paper/Tide Pods
