FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION SERMON SERIES

The stories, scriptures, and traditions of the Christmas season have been passed down to us throughout the generations. Many of us enter this season with a swell of memories and emotions. Not only does Christmas connect us to past traditions and family members no longer with us, it connects us to those who experienced the first Christmas, with all its wonder and mystery. For our Advent sermon series, we'll be looking at the ways the birth of Christ reminds us of our call to be the family of God. Join us this Advent as we remember that Christmas is first and foremost about the gift of the Christ child to his family of faith - to Mary and Joseph, to the shepherds, to the saints of the past, and to you and me.

Dec. 4 - Luke 1:46-56 - Naming the Future - Mary is so excited about Jesus' birth that she sings about it! In her song, she predicts the impact Jesus will have on our world. What hopes do we have for ourselves, our family, and our community this Christmas?

A WORD FROM KORY....

Wow! This past Sunday was one of the most special days I've experienced in my 13 years at Crestwood! We had the blessing of our children leading both worship services to celebrate Universal

Children's Sunday, an Elders lunch after church welcoming our new members, and the ordination service for (now!) Rev. Kelly Hale that afternoon. By Sunday night, I was worn out, but it was the best kind of worn out that a pastor can have. God is good!

The worship services were especially meaningful to me. Our kids did an amazing job of leading us in a way that was not gimmicky or cutesy, but took seriously the tasks they were called to do. I was blown away but how calm and confident every child was, from those who offered the prayers to the those handing out bulletins. The children's choir was amazing and Missy's sermon was exactly on point. We are so blessed with such wonderful leadership in our children's ministry.

I know that the kids and leaders have been working for months on Universal Children's Sunday, but in reality, the seeds for this past Sunday were planted much longer ago. In 2014, this congregation began a process to renovate our Children's Wing, which was built in the early 1960s and hadn't been updated much since. It had sterile concrete walls, an industrial drop ceiling, and a "dark and scary" hallway that led to it. It was not an inviting space at all, and yet we continued to have new families visit and join every Sunday.

So, we decided to explore what it would take to make our Children's Wing truly hospitable to our children and their families. We worked with Joe Rasnick of Integrity Architecture, who presented a bold dream for our space, including a new nursery and choir room, an expanded arts and crafts room, and a welcoming flex space in the middle of the wing. It was exactly what we were dreaming of.

But dreams aren't free! To help us figure out how to pay for it, we worked with a consultant, who told us it would be a challenge for us to raise enough money to make it happen. But we took a leap of faith and proceeded anyway, and we raised about \$400,000 more than what our consultant said was possible. To date, we are \$132,000 away from completely paying off this \$1.7 million project. Again, God is good!

It was this church's bold faith that made Sunday possible. The kids who led worship on Sunday have grown up in that wing, getting to know each other and experiencing the depth of God's love for them through the teachers, Worship and Wonder leaders, and other volunteers who've cared for and taught them. They've had fun in Sunday School, laughed their way through Vacation Bible School, and learned about the Bible through Worship and Wonder. Sunday's worship was the fruit of our decision to plant seeds eight years ago.

And here's an example of how God works through these things. One of the children participating in Sunday's service was Ann Ashby Rasnick. You may recognize Ann Ashby's last name. She's the daughter of the architect who designed our Children's Wing and subsequently joined the church with his family. Because of your generosity seven years ago, Ann Ashby and dozens of other children have found a church home where they feel in tangible ways the love of Jesus each Sunday.

During this season of Advent, our sermon series called "From Generation to is Generation," as we remember the importance of passing on the faith to those who come after us, just as we received it from those who came before us. Crestwood, we are indeed honoring God in the ways that pass on what we have learned and what we know about the love of Jesus Christ. As we await the birth of the Christ child, let's always remember how the seeds of faith we plant today bear fruit in the generations to come. Say it with me...God is aood!

DECEMBER SERVICE PROJECT: CHRYSALIS HOUSE

The mission of Chrysalis House is to provide family oriented support for women with substance use disorders. Established in 1978, Chrysalis House is Kentucky's oldest and largest licensed residential treatment program allowing women to keep their infants and toddlers with them during treatment. It is a comprehensive agency that provides mental health treatment. case management. domestic violence counseling. computer training, GED tutoring, vocational training, job placement assistance, and children's services. Their specialty is helping pregnant mothers become substance abuse free. Chrysalis House has a high success rate with graduates staying sober, working in jobs that support their families, earning their GEDs, living in their own housing, and giving back to the community that once supported them.
