**HAPPY NEW YEAR, CRESTWOOD!** 

#### A WORD FROM KORY...

Last Monday night, Amy and I had just finished watching an episode of a show when I said, "Want to watch a little of the Bengals game?" I knew that wouldn't be Amy's first choice, but she knows my love for the Bengals and graciously agreed. We turned on the game and

watched about three plays before Damar Hamlin collapsed on the field. We watched with growing concern as we realized this was not your typical football injury. The sight of teammates in tears, the arrival of the ambulance, and the ultimate suspension of the game...in just a few moments a sporting event was put in perspective and we were confronted with the sanctity and fragility of life.

I was also reminded of these past few weeks as we lost important church members and people I considered friends. I know death is a natural part of life and it's my job to reassure people of the hope that comes from God's promises, but losing someone you love and respect still hurts, no matter how much you can celebrate their resurrection in God's kingdom. I believe with all my heart that these people are with God in Heaven, but that doesn't diminish the grief of losing them.

It is in these moments of trauma and tragedy where God's presence can become most palpable. I followed Damar Hamlin's story and saw the outpouring of love and concern, witnessed the coming together of opposing teams to support him and his family, read about the millions of dollars that flowed into his charitable organization. People put aside their team allegiances to wear the colors of the Buffalo Bills and express their support for Damar.

Similarly, at the recent funerals I saw people from different walks of life come together to support the grieving families. I heard memories shared that evoked laughter and tears and learned of the profound influence these people had on countless lives. I was reminded that we are not alone as we walk our journeys of life, and that compassion is still alive in our world today (even though at times it appears to be in hiding). All of this has been a stark reminder that life is fragile and not to be taken for granted.

I've also been reminded of the fact that we have no idea of the impact our lives can have on others, even the parts of our lives that don't get much attention. How many people knew about Damar Hamlin's non-profit before his collapse? The original goal for Chasing M's was \$2500, but it has recently surpassed \$8.5 million in donations.

Romans 8 reminds us that "God is at work in all things to bring about good." I can think of no better example of that statement than what's happened because of Hamlin's tragedy.

But you don't have to be a professional football player to make an impact. As I listened to friends and family tell stories about those who had died, I heard tangible evidence of how one word, one decision, one action can have a lasting, transformative effect on another person. The truth is that we have the opportunity every single day to live out our faith, and we have no idea how God might use that to pour out love and grace on others.

I'm so thankful that Damar Hamlin continues to make an amazing recovery. And I'm sad that my two friends are no longer with us in person, although their spirit lives on in and around me. In each of these cases, I'm glad for the reminder that, even in the worst situations, God is there, comforting, healing, reassuring us that death is not the end of our lives. I've renewed my commitment to take advantage of the opportunities God has given me to choose faith over fear and hope over despair. I give thanks to the people in my life who've shown me how to do that, whether they be friends or congregation members or football players. I pray I can be that person for someone else.





#### JANUARY SERVICE PROJECT: GREENHOUSE17

GreenHouse17 is a non-profit organization committed to ending intimate partner abuse in families in the community. The shelter is located in rural Fayette County and serves individuals and families in 17 counties. They are located on a 40 acre farm. Residents farm the land to offer nature based healing, nutritious farm to table produce and job training for survivors. Specially trained crisis counselors are available to help survivors twenty-four hours each day and 365 days a year for crisis intervention and stabilization through individual and group counseling as well as assisting with children's services.

GreenHouse17 can only accept NEW supplies and not previously owned items as their policy dictates due to Covid protocols. NEW items needed are as follows:

Adult and children's toothbrushes Sanitary pads and tampons Shampoo and conditioner Body wash and soap Hair brushes and combs Textured hair care products such as hair oil, deep conditioners, wide tooth combs Lotion Adults and children's underwear Pull up diapers, all sizes Cleaning supplies Paper towels Toilet paper NEW Twin size bedding especially "beds in a bag" that includes comforter Gift cards to Walmart, Kroger, and Target
