

A WORD FROM KORY...

I'm writing this article from the airport in Dallas (don't be too jealous, it's in the 40s here), where I'm flying home from attending the Disciples Senior Pastors conference. This yearly gathering is for the pastors of the 100 largest Disciples churches and features a noted

speaker, great fellowship, and time away from the demands of our congregations to do some bigpicture thinking. Sadly, this is the last of these conferences because determining congregational size is hard to do when worship attendance is no longer reliably measured. When you have 200 people in the sanctuary and 100 views online, how do you determine your actual attendance?

This year's focus for the conference was on congregational change and conflict. Thankfully, conflict is something Crestwood has very little of. Honestly, it's the healthiest church I know of and has been since its founding. But change is something all churches go through, and the last few years have exacerbated that. We have not so much chosen to change as we've been forced to change, figuring out how to weather a national pandemic, how to stay united during a contentious political era, and how to come back together as a community in ways that honor Christ and include all those who call Crestwood their church home.

What I learned this week in Dallas is that Crestwood is not alone in trying to figure all this out. Regardless of the size of the church or its location, every congregation is asking the same kinds of questions: Who are we now? How do we live out the gospel in this changed world? What does our community look like post-Covid? Our group of about 30 pastors spent some time lamenting what we've lost, but even more time dreaming about what God can do through this time of transition.

But transition means change, and as a church (and human beings!) we don't always like change. God knows, we've had more than our share of it in the last few years! And yet, for us to not just survive but thrive, we're going to have to continue to innovate and ask what it means to be Christ followers in this evolving world. The world is moving too fast for us to settle into what is comfortable and easy. After all, Christ never called us to stay where we are. He called us to follow him.

The challenge is that we don't have a roadmap for what that means. We can't read books about the last worldwide pandemic that shut down the church for 14 months to glean insights or wisdom. We have to figure this out, but we don't have to do it alone.

We have each other, we have other churches going through the same thing, and we have the love and grace of Christ, who walks with us.

So, we need to stay attentive to what God is saying to us. Through scripture, through sermons, through study and prayer, God has a word for us for this very time and place. In addition, we need to listen to each other. As one person at the conference said, "We need to check in instead of checking out." I believe the Holy Spirit speaks through us to make God's will known for us, as individuals and as a congregation. That's why we need as many voices as possible sharing what they hear God is saying.

We'll be doing that through our strategic planning process, which I plan to resurrect soon. We had embarked on this journey when the pandemic hit and we've not yet been able to get it going again. But I'm committed to forming a team that will help us discern God's will for us and paint a picture of what Crestwood is called to do in the next three to five years. It's both exciting and scary as we open ourselves up to God's leading. I have no doubt that we will be called to do amazing things in God's name. But I also have no doubt that this call will involve change.

So, we can choose to stay the same and ensure our complacency, or we can choose to take the leap into whatever future God has planned for us. I know which option is safer, but I also know which one is more exciting. Are you ready, Crestwood? Are you ready to ask God what God has planned for us? It might not be what we expect. It might mean we have to break out of our comfort zones. It might mean we look different in five years than we do today. But, really, is there any other way to live this life of faith? So...let's leap together and trust God's presence with us as we fly.

FEBRUARY SERVICE PROJECT: THE NEST



The Nest is an agency that has been serving the Lexington area since 1977. It is a lifeline for all individuals and families in crisis, facing adversity or who have unexpected needs. Programs are free for early childhood education,

family assistance for basic human needs, counseling and advocacy for survivors of intimate partner violence and education and support for parents. Everyone who needs the services of The Nest can rest assured that safety is number one as this agency prioritizes the mental, physical and emotional wellbeing of their clients, team and partners.

The Nest provides caregivers equal access to high quality child care providers, personal hygiene necessities, car seats and children's clothing.

Counseling is provided for intimate partner violence in both individual and group settings as well as legal advocacy for survivors.

Parenting classes for female and male caregivers that focus on healthy parenting are provided in order to assist caregivers in helping them to become skilled and knowledgeable caregivers for the children that they support.

This month Crestwood's service project is The Nest. They only need one item for February to support their Diaper Drive. Diapers may be placed in the Giving Lane (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing):




