A WORD FROM KORY...

"It's the most wonderful time of the year..." That's right, it's Lent! You may be thinking I've lost a few of my marbles (and you may be right!), but Lent is one of my favorite seasons of the year. It's such a meaningful time in the life of the church, filled with

opportunities to learn about our relationship with God and grow in our faith.

We're already off to a powerful start with a moving Ash Wednesday service last week and the start to our "Seeking" sermon series. I'm excited to explore with you some of the questions that people asked Jesus, expecting that we might have the same questions. Asking questions is an important way for us to go deeper in our faith and I'm so thankful to serve a church that welcomes such curiosity and wonder.

There's another reason Lent is my favorite time of year, and it also involves growth, curiosity, and LOTS of questions. It's our Pastor's Class! After a class of 14 youth last year, I was assured that this year's crop of fifth graders was much smaller and I could expect to be able to catch my breath a bit. Good! I was ready to help an intimate gathering of just a few youth explore their faith and consider the important decision of baptism.

Well...this year's class has 12 youth in it, and believe me, I'm not complaining! We are so blessed at Crestwood with families who encourage their youth to participate in church and take the next steps in their journey of faith. The class started last Sunday and will run for five weeks, with Baptism Sunday on April 23. Will you join me in praying for these youth?

I know we'll have a great time together as we move toward the decision to be baptized.

But youth aren't the only ones who have questions about faith! I've had enough adults say to me,

"Wow, I wish I could take Pastor's Class again!" that I decided to give them that opportunity. Each Sunday, I'm hosting a "Pastor's Class for Adults," a chance for grown-ups to ask their questions and wrestle with the challenges of being a follower of Jesus Christ. There's no agenda for these classes. Rather, it will be a time of inviting students to think about questions ("Who is Jesus? What is the church?") in ways that will generate discussion and dialogue.

My hope with all we have going on during Lent is that we are encouraged to step back from our daily routines and contemplate the role of faith in our lives. Sometimes, in our relationship with God, we forget which one of us is divine. We get so wrapped up in our own lives that we can't see the places where we are cracked. Because we're not as bad as others, we think that we don't need saving. And yet, Jesus didn't come to earth as a savior for the really bad folks; he came as a savior for us all, because ALL of us need saving. But we can't claim that truth if we don't walk the journey of Lent.

So, I hope you will join us on this journey by committing to attending worship and participating in some of the learning opportunities we offer. Besides the Crestwood University, we have a number of different ways for you to connect: Sunday School, Bible study, family workshops, women's circles, men's breakfast. Lent is a wonderful time to make an intentional decision to commit to your relationship with God. Your church family stands beside you and your ministerial staff is here to support you. Let's make this Lent the most meaningful yet!

I'm pleased to share that on Monday, March 6, I will defend my Doctor of Ministry project at Lexington Theological Seminary. I'll meet with a team of three scholar-practitioners and other LTS faculty and staff to defend my project, which is called, "Good Sermon, Pastor!: Evaluating Ministers in the Context of a Congregation's Mission." It's hard to believe that this journey that started in September of 2018 is now coming to a close. I ask for your prayers as I prepare to defend my work. If all goes well, I will graduate on June 16 right here at Crestwood!



MARCH SERVICE PROJECT: NATALIE'S SISTERS AND THE WELL

"The most pervasive myth about human trafficking is that it often involves kidnapping or physically forcing someone into a situation. The truth is that most traffickers use psychological means such as tricking, defrauding, manipulating or threatening victims into providing commercial sex or forced labor." ..National Human Trafficking Hotline

In Lexington we have two agencies who assist victims of human trafficking by providing respite and referrals to community resources. These two agencies are Natalie's Sisters and The Well.

The Drop in service center at Natalie's Sisters offers a warm breakfast, healthy snack, nutritious lunch and referrals to community services to those in need.

The Well provides a holistic program of safe housing, recovery support, education and healing for individuals exploited by sex and labor trafficking/exploitation. They keep children and youth from falling prey to traffickers by providing outreach programs to at risk youth.


