As you know, the high school youth are taking an international mission trip this summer to Costa Rica. We'll be working with Strong Missions to help the people in the area around San Jose, working to renovate homes, providing learning op-

portunities for local children, and learning about the culture and unique needs of the people there and how we can support them. We will be there for six days, and we have eight people going with us. This promises to be a life-changing event!

Here is your chance to participate with us! We will be selling stock in the youth group on Sunday, May 14. Stock certificates will be available for purchase for any price. There will be a table set up in the Narthex both Sundays. After the mission trip, all stockholders will be invited to a special dinner, during which we will show pictures and tell stories about our time in Costa Rica.

The money raised through the sale of stock will help us pay for our airfare and ground transportation while on the trip. Please prayerfully consider this mission trip and the profound effect it will have on both the youth and



the people we help. An investment in the Crestwood Costa Rica Mission Trip will reap great rewards in the hearts of countless people.

#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY FUNDRAISING

This is an important year for the Disciples churches in Lexington in its collaboration with Lexington Habitat for Humanity. This year Disciples for Habitat will help build and sponsor its 40th house! (Crestwood will have helped with 38 of them!) That is the most by any group in the city. We are really proud of this great tradition. We are truly making a difference in dealing with homelessness in Lexington.

This year's house is located at 429 Ash Street. The homeowners will be Uunda, Claris, and their three daughters (Nyota (age 3), Ungwa (age 1), and Eto (age 1). They fled the Democratic Republic of Congo and spent a few years in Tanzania before arriving in the U.S. Uunda works in production at Yokohama and Claris cares for their daughters.



As co-sponsors of a house, we contribute toward the cost of the building materials through fundraising during the month of May. Crestwood's goal is \$20,667. To make a monetary contribution make your check out to Crestwood Christian Church with "Habitat" on the memo line, or place cash in the pew envelope annotated "Habitat" on the outside.

The dates for Phase 1 of the construction are May 17, 18, 19, 20, 25, 26, June 2, 3, 9, 10, 23, 24.
