SERMON SERIES - THE KIN-DOM OF GOD: WITHIN US, AMONG US

The theme for the 2023 General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is "Kindom of God: Within us, Among Us." As Rev. Yvonne Gilmore, Associate General Minister and Interim Administrative Secretary for the National Convocation, wrote: "'Kindom' is not a spelling error or a replacement for the word kingdom. It's a way of connecting the 'kin' that God makes and expanding our imagination about Jesus."

In the last few years, violent political radicalization, a literal plague, cascading natural disasters, all have served to deepen fractures in our faith communities and bodies of belonging. We are much more likely to imagine our neighbor as our enemy than as our kin in the body of Christ.

By dwelling on what it means to be the Kin-dom of God, we invite the Holy Spirit to once again reorient us around the True Love which saves and liberates and unites us all. Remember what Paul taught the church in Ephesus: "now you are no longer strangers and aliens. Rather, you are fellow citizens with God's people, and you belong to God's household." We became God's household because Christ came and dwelled amongst us, bringing the Kindom of God near. Christ's power and presence is not diminished! The Kin-dom of God is here.

A WORD FROM KORY...



My Uncle Jack died in October 2021. He was my dad's brother, the oldest of four siblings. He was kind and generous, a wonderful singer and supporter of local theater. I just assumed he would live forever. I was supposed to perform his funeral but got

COVID a few days before and had to miss it. His death, along with my parents' recent health issues, was a stark reminder that my relatives are not getting any younger and we are entering a new phase in life where we have to say goodbye to people we love.

Not long after Uncle Jack's funeral, my Uncle Mark suggested that he, my cousins (Jack's two sons), and I go on a hiking trip out west. Life is fleeting, and we need to make memories and hold connections as long as we can. We take way too much for granted and live with regrets about promises unfulfilled and opportunities not taken. So, this Sunday evening, my cousins and I will fly to Denver to meet up with my uncle and aunt for a few days of hiking and reconnecting. I'm looking forward to my time with family.

That theme of connection was also prevalent during our time in Costa Rica on the CYF mission trip. Four high schoolers and four adults spent a week serving God by mixing concrete, hauling rocks, and leading Vacation Bible School for the kids of the community. We stayed at Strong Missions, hosted by Charlie Strong, his sidekick Oscar Solano, and the kitchen staff. They were incredibly gracious and flexible, patiently dealing with this group of people who had great intentions (if not always the skills to follow through). Thanks to them and the gifts of our group (which ranged from concrete work to craft-making to excellent knowledge of Spanish), we were able to make some progress in the work the mission was doing in the community.

Along the way, we made some life-long connections. Oscar became everyone's new best friend, joking with us and leading us each day. Sol, the homeowner, made us lemonade while we worked in the hot sun to build her a new kitchen. We served along side Reuben and Warner, who spoke zero English but showed us

how to do the job. Not surprisingly, I connected with Charlie over our love of puns and with Sam, the mission center dog. And, of course, the eight of us connected with each other over shared experiences, delicious meals, and travel challenges.

Connections are the fabric of life. In Genesis 2, God says about Adam, "It is not good that man should be alone." We find our truest selves when we see our identity reflected in the eyes of someone else. It is through our relationships that we discover who we are and who we're called to be. It is in connection that we are shown those two most important words: "You belong."

I hope you have felt that sense of belonging here at Crestwood. We strive to treat everyone with compassion and see in them the beautiful image of God. We take seriously the call to love God and love our neighbor, especially those among us who are hurting, grieving, or facing unknown futures.

To make sure we continue this important work of connecting with each other, the Personnel Committee has approved the creation of an Interim Minister for Pastoral Care position. The person in this position will coordinate all aspects of care within our church family. That doesn't mean they will do all of that themselves. Instead, they will work with the rest of the staff and with me to make sure everyone is being visited, loved on, and cared for. I hope to have someone in place for this position by mid-July.

In this time of transition at Crestwood, it's more important than ever that we stay connected. As Trish said so eloquently in her last sermon, the church is bigger than any one person. The church is not just each of us, it is ALL of us, and we need each other to continue doing the work God has called us to do.

In my 13 ½ years here, my door has always been open to you. I welcome your comments, your questions, your cares, your concerns. I love being connected with you! Please let me know how I can serve you as we look forward to the future God has in store for Crestwood.

ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL BUILDING TRIP TO WESTERN KENTUCKY



Thirteen Lexington Disciple church members volunteered in a successful mission building trip to Western Kentucky 5/7/23 - 5/12/23. The trip's purpose was to help rebuild after the tornadoes of 12/10/21. Crestwood and its World Outreach Committee helped sponsor the trip. Crestwood's volunteers were Lucy Wells, John Brown, and Steve Seithers. Becky Ewalt Tossey, a former Crestwood member, who

lives in Cincinnati, also volunteered. We stayed at a very nice church, the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Madisonville, KY.

Under the leadership of the Fuller Disaster Rebuilders we were able to work on four houses in and near Dawson Springs, KY. We painted most of the interior and exterior trim and doors, and installed an exterior door on a remodelled house that had lost its entire roof due to the tornado. We built a wooden porch deck that stretched across the front and part of one side for a replacement house. We installed a countertop at another replacement house. And finally we did touch up painting and laid sod at another replacement house. Two pairs of our old shoes were thrown out due to the rain and mud while installing the sod! The home owners were very appreciative of our efforts.

It will take several years to rebuild Western Kentucky. But thanks to Crestwood and volunteers we are making a start!

Our next Mission Building Trip to Western Kentucky is scheduled for 9/17/23 - 9/22/23. The cost is \$125. If you are interested in going, please contact Steve Seithers at Seeithers@gmail.com!
