A WORD FROM KORY...



Can you feel it? The Spirit is moving through Crestwood in exciting ways! As we transition out of summer and into the routine that August brings, we're starting to see signs that the church is fully coming back to life after a few years of uncertainty and disconnect during and following the pandemic. Here are some of those signs:

- During our Blessing of the Backpacks on Aug. 13, the entire stairs were filled with children and youth (and a few adults) as we prayed over their return to school.
- During **Promotion Sunday** on Aug. 20, we gave out 26 Bibles to our 3-5 graders as we helped them celebrate their move into a new grade.
- That same evening, our Back-to-School Bash had over 80 people joining together for good food, fellowship, and lots of fun! Around 40 of those people participated in our Intergenerational Cornhole Tournament, in which a child or youth was paired with an adult to compete as a team. It was such a joy to watch those new connections being made!
- Our Senior Adult Ministry is back in full swing, with two trips planned and a bunch folks already signed up.
- On Sunday, Aug. 27, we had 10 people attend a Worship and Wonder training as they committed to help our kids learn the love of lesus.
- That same Sunday, Steph had 20 youth join her for her Wake Up with Wallace Sunday School and then 18 showed up for the Youth Group kickoff.

One participant in the Worship and Wonder training texted later and said, "Thank you for the training today. It was very good! I also wanted to say that I felt more connected to church today than I had in a very long time. I'm happy that I am involved again. I can't wait for a great year at church!"

That comment highlights for me what I know to be true deep in my bones. God created us to be in relationship with each other, and one of our primary purposes in life is to be part of a community. We can't sit around and wait for connections to happen. In order to feel connected

to someone or something, we have to do our part by reaching out and finding ways to make and maintain those connections.

Another example of the importance of connection: Last week, I had an email exchange with a church member I hadn't seen in several months, just to catch up and make sure this person was OK. This past Sunday, that person was in church again and expressed how good it felt to be back with their church family. I said it a few weeks ago in worship: There's no such thing as an individual Christian. We are called to be in community together. Not only does the church have something to offer us, but the church benefits from the gifts and graces we bring when we are here.

This fall, Crestwood will have a number of different ways for you to connect to God and each other. No matter your age, ability, or interest, you can find something that will help you grow in your faith and in your relationship with Christ. Bible studies, book discussions, Crestwood University, Sunday School classes, children's and youth events...these are great ways for you to find your place at Crestwood and connect with your church family. You can learn more about all these opportunities in this newsletter.

We need each other. We are called to be the body of Christ, and we're not as strong when there are pieces missing. There are a number of legitimate reasons why people haven't been coming to church, but for most of us, it's a matter of prioritization. If we make our faith a priority, then church becomes an integral part of our and our family's lives. For those we see on a regular basis, thank you for your commitment to Christ through Crestwood. And for those we haven't seen in a while, we miss you. I hope to see you all on Sunday!



September Service Project: Lexington Rescue Mission

HOPE is on the menu. That's right, HOPE!

Lexington Rescue Mission has been in existence since 2000. It was founded by Jim and Becky Connell who wanted to start a ministry to help the poor and homeless. In November of 2021, the mission offered a Thanksgiving meal at Broadway Christian Church where those in attendance could receive not only a nourishing meal, but clothing, financial assistance, bible studies and chapel services. Over the years, the mission has grown to include helping the people it serves find employment, substance abuse treatment, and simply rebuilding broken lives on the foundation of lesus Christ.

Today Lexington Rescue Mission provides community meals from 9:00-10:00 AM and 12:00-1:00 PM Monday through Saturday at its location 444 Glen Arvin Avenue. These meals are served with a hearty side of HOPE. For many who come to the mission they find HOPE along with food. HOPE to get them back on their feet to help them find that everlasting job, HOPE to find a place to live and HOPE to overcome addiction if needed. Lexington Rescue Mission provides HOPE for those it serves to return to a life where they can become a self- sufficient and contributing member of our community.

The following items are needed and may be placed in the Giving Lane, under the sign for <u>Disciples Women's Ministries</u> (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing):


