#### A WORD FROM KORY...



Crestwood has been honored to be part of a five-year project conducted by Lexington Theological Seminary on Thriving Congregations. Funded by the Lily Foundation, the project has sought to help congregations discover their unique gifts and use them to serve God in their communities. These congregations have been diverse

in location, size, and ethnicity. It's been so inspiring to work with LTS and these other churches to see what God is up to in our lives!

The final gathering for this project will be in November in Phoenix, and in preparation, I attended a webinar recently about how to evaluate the effectiveness of your church. As part of that gathering, we were asked to answer this question: "Think ahead to the year 2026. Looking out across the landscape of your project and your specific programmatic aims, what would be happening that would convince you that all of your collective efforts have succeeded?"

What a great question! What do you think Crestwood will look like in 2026? What ministries will be continuing to do great work, what new ones will have started? What will have changed, what will have stayed the same? It's a hard question to answer because we don't know who will be here. Each time a new person joins Crestwood, our congregation changes, based on the gifts that person or family is bringing.

Here's how I answered that question:

- A thriving lay leadership
- Exemplary children's and youth ministries
- Outreach ministries that are more hands-on than writing a check
- All age groups feel they have a place in the life of the church
- Crestwood known as a place to have conversations about difficult topics

Some of these things are already happening at Crestwood, and I expect they will continue to thrive (e.g., our children's and youth ministries). Some of the points are goals for existing ministries (e.g., striving to be more intergenerational so each person finds their place). And some of them are goals I have for us (like

hosting conversations about challenging topics). I'd be curious to know: What are your dreams for Crestwood's future?

A church that wants to be around in 30 years is constantly asking itself these kinds of questions. Rather than focusing on surviving in the present, the thriving congregation is always keeping their eyes open and looking ahead to where God is calling it to be in the future. The guiding question is never "What now?" but "What's next?"

I'm excited about what's next for Crestwood, and we'll be spending some time in the next year or so seeking to answer that question related to our staffing needs and our programs and ministries. I don't know how those questions will be answered, but I do know this: We need each and every one of you to be part of helping to shape Crestwood's future.

That starts now with our "Committed" stewardship campaign. So many churches are struggling financially as they deal with the aftereffects of the pandemic and an aging (and sometimes declining) membership. Crestwood has always bucked that trend, continuing to thrive in the face of the challenges. Our giving actually went UP during the pandemic! As we prepare for 2024, I'm hopeful that our generosity will continue to be on full display as we sow the seeds for God's working through us.

Please consider how your 2024 pledge will help us become who God is calling us to be. As each of us plays our part, we take our place in the body of Christ, answering the call to be co-laborers for God's kin-dom here on earth. So, Crestwood, as you contemplate your giving for next year, I have one question for you...what's next?

### ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL MISSION BUILDING TRIP TO WESTERN KENTUCKY!

Eleven Lexington Disciple church members volunteered in a successful mission building trip to Western Kentucky 9/17/23 - 9/22/23. The trip's purpose was to help rebuild after the tornadoes of 12/10/21. Crestwood and its World Outreach Committee helped sponsor the trip. Crestwood's volunteers were John Brown and Steve Seithers. Becky Ewalt Tossey, a former Crestwood member who lives in Cincinnati, also volunteered. We stayed at a very nice church, the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Madisonville, KY.

Under the leadership of the Fuller Disaster Rebuilders we were able to work on three houses in and near Barnsley and Dawson Springs, KY. We installed laminate flooring and baseboards in an entire basement of a house that was being rebuilt. We also installed cabinet grade panels on the walls of the main floor and a tin ceiling on over half of that floor. We secured, insulated, and installed a vapor barrier for the front door. The couple who lived there rode out the storm in a 1950's nuclear bomb shelter! They are currently living in an RV parked on the property but plan on moving into the basement which we finished for them.

On another house we installed the seal plate and the rigid foam insulation for the crawl space. We dug a trench so that workers could crawl under the floor beam. After some contractors installed the floor and outer walls, we returned to install hurricane straps. We used over 1000 nails!

On the final house, we finished the porch decking, installed kitchen cabinet knobs and counter top, blew in attic insulation, and designed and built a crawl space door.

What joy and fun we had in fellowship and in helping others! It will take several years to rebuild Western Kentucky. But thanks to Crestwood and volunteers we are making a start!

#### LOCAL OUTREACH


