CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TO VOTE ON 2024 BUDGET

Sunday, Dec. 17, after 10:45 AM service

At the November 15, 2023, the Administrative Board approved the 2024 budget recommended by the Finance Committee.

It was a difficult task to achieve a balanced 2024 budget to meet the mission and priorities of Crestwood in a challenging financial environment. However, since the Board meeting, we have received additional pledges or increases in pledges of approximately \$21,000 which has allowed us to increase the percentage of Outreach giving in the original budget presented to the Board from 10.05 % to 12.45%. Overall we are still budgeting for a decrease in pledges from 2023 of \$19,365.

The majority of ministry teams requested no increase in their budgets or increases of \$500 or less. The Property budget was increased by \$23,120. Fifteen thousand (\$15,000) of this increase is for the cleaning service and are funds that were re-allocated from Personnel. The Finance Committee budget was increased by \$9,904 due to an anticipated increase in our insurance premiums of fifteen percent (15%). Personnel requested an increase of \$27,395.00, which includes increased health premiums and raises for staff.

Even with the additional pledge revenues noted above, in order to achieve the required balanced budget, and fund our Outreach giving at 12.45 %, after much discussion, Finance asked Personnel to remove the funding for the full-time associate minister position for 2024. This position, with salary and benefits, was funded at \$98,000. The Administrative Board has appointed a task force to look at staffing needs for Crestwood, with a goal of completing its work by late summer. Recommendations from the task force will be available in time for the budget preparations for the 2025 budget.


