A WORD FROM KORY...

I received a handwritten note a few days ago from a frequent guest at Crestwood. The note, addressed to Missy and me (the family has small children), read, "We just wanted to thank you both so much for welcoming our

family to Crestwood this year! You have both been so gracious with your time and hospitality, making it easier for us to feel our way into finding a church home. Our children are loving the time we've spent at Crestwood this year – thank you for welcoming them in. We look forward to joining the church officially!"

Praise God! We've had quite a run of new members since Dec. 3, with a total of 41 people choosing to make Crestwood their church home. That's more than we usually have in a year! Each week we see more new faces in our pews as people are looking for a church home. In fact, you might look around and not recognize many faces. How does that make you feel?

My first response is, "That's a good thing!" After all, having people visit your church is an important part of welcoming new members and growing the church in order to serve God better. We want to see new faces on Sunday morning, and we want to make them feel welcome. Based on the past few months, I say we're being faithful to that calling.

However, if all the new faces are a little disorienting, I understand, and it's OK to feel that way. Many of us want church to be a familiar place. In a world that changes so rapidly, we feel our church home should be a place of stability and comfort. We want to know that when we go there, we'll feel that we're with family. And when a bunch of new people start coming, we lose that feeling. All of a sudden, we're surrounded by strangers, not family.

Granted, more visitors to worship on Sunday can also mean more challenges. More babies in the nursery mean more staff are needed. More people mean more bulletins and more communion supplies. It is harder to find a place to sit when there are more guests in the pews. And some of them may look, talk, act, and sing differently from us. I don't say this facetiously; I honestly recognize that more guests on Sunday changes our worship experience. What's happening to our church family?

Forty-one new members in six weeks. That's a lot of new faces to get to know, which takes an effort on our part. We have to be willing to step out of our pew and extend a hospitable welcome, just as someone did to us our first time here. As you may remember, it's not an easy thing to visit a church for the first time. It can be an anxious experience, filled with questions: Will I know when to stand and sit? What if my child is unruly? Will I be told I'm going to Hell? Will people like me? How our guests answer those questions is up to us.

So, we have work to do. We have to be ready for a full nursery and a stream of people coming through the door. We have to be ready to move over in our pew so someone new can sit there, or to get up and sit with someone who is visiting with us so they don't feel alone. Our hope is that as we make them feel welcome, they will in turn do the same for someone else in the future. You don't grow a church with pastors or programs; you grow it with people who embody the love and hospitality of Christ.

Are you willing to serve as a greeter or usher, welcoming everyone who comes through the doors on Sunday? Let me know. Are you willing to lend your voice to worship as a liturgist? Let me know. Do you have an idea about how we can be more hospitable to our guests? Let me know. The only way we're going to fulfill God's vision for us to connect people to God and each other is if each of us does our part to make someone new feel at home. We are doing our best to shine God's light into this world, and people are taking notice. Let's make sure they see the hospitality of Jesus when they step into our building. Keep up the good work, Crestwood.

JANUARY DWM SERVICE PROJECT



GreenHouse17 is a non-profit organization committed to ending intimate partner abuse in families in the community. The shelter is located in rural Fayette County and serves individuals and families in 17 counties. They are located on a 40-acre farm. Residents farm the land to offer nature-based healing, nutritious farm-to-table produce and job training for survivors. Specially trained crisis counselors are available to help survivors 24 hours each day and 365 days a year for crisis intervention and stabilization through individual and group counseling as well as assisting with children's services.

GreenHouse17 can accept only NEW supplies and not previously owned items, as their policy dictates due to Covid protocols. NEW items needed are as follows:

- Adult and children's toothbrushes
- Sanitary pads and tampons
- Shampoo and conditioner
- Body wash and soap
- Hair brushes and combs
- Textured hair care products such as hair oil, deep conditioners, wide tooth combs
- Lotion
- Adult and children's underwear
- Pull up diapers, all sizes
- Cleaning supplies
- Paper towels
- Toilet paper
- NEW Twin size bedding, especially "beds in a bag" that includes comforter
- Gift cards to Walmart, Kroger, and Target

STAR WORD STORIES

Happy New Year! I hope that as you have been praying over your Star Word, your conversations with God are bringing you joy and growth. As we move further into the new year, I invite you to share your stories with Steph Wallace, so we can all see how this project is making a difference in our lives. Here is a story from a congregation member who shared her journal entry the day after she received her Star Word:

January 1, 2024

The New Year begins! Yesterday Steph Wallace preached a sermon called "Gifts and Guiding Stars." As we left the sanctuary, we were invited to select a gold star with a word to contemplate in the new year -- a "Star Word" or "Guiding Star."

My word is "Learn." Some people seemed to dread their word, seeing it as likely to be an unwelcome or difficult assignment, a New Year's Resolution you didn't even choose. But I was excited about the prospect and am pleased with "Learn." What does it mean? What should I do about it?

My first thought (very me) was to make a list of things I'd like to learn in 2024. But almost as fast, I thought that was too much me and not enough God. Too much me because it reduced a spiritual exercise intended for the whole year to a list (SO very me) of tasks to be accomplished in order to achieve closure so I could think of myself as successful. To define the limits and prescribe the thing from the get-go. On my terms, with limited (if any) inspiration from the Holy Spirit (although I might have prayed about it for a few minutes first).

Next I thought I'd look up "learn" in my Bible's miniconcordance and see where that led. But this too was me wanting to rush to "the right answer," to figure out what my Star Word indicates God wants of me for 2024. And get it all mapped out on January 1. Again, I didn't take the time to meaningfully pray, asking the Holy Spirit to guide me to helpful insight. And the worthlessness of my self-guided effort became apparent pretty quickly.

The citation whose brief synopsis "spoke" to me – "that each of you should learn" – was 1 Thessalonians 4:4, which is about avoiding sexual immorality. Not one of my many regular sins. So where am I, after racing this way and that, trying to discern what "Learn" means for me in 2024? I'm now thinking I will pray about it more intentionally (and not just once), and enter the year with "Learn" at the forefront of my mind, so that I might recognize what God offers me when it comes, all throughout the year. Maybe, instead of my own halfbaked hurrying from one possible "solution" to another, I will try a bit of Psalm 37:7 and "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him." Maybe I'm starting to learn something already. HAPPY NEW YEAR! I am so very thankful for each and every one of you in our youth programs here at Crestwood... What a year 2023 was for us - filled with so many



blessings! We now eagerly anticipate all that God has in store for us in 2024! We will take fun trips, spend a great deal of time and energy serving others as we are called to do as disciples of Jesus, and grow in our faith through learning, serving, and relationshipbuilding.
