# A WORD FROM KORY



Are you sick? It seems that most of the people I know have some kind of illness, from Covid to the flu to the general crud that seems to have infiltrated Lexington. I just recently finally stopped coughing after what felt like months. It's amazing how we

take something so simple as unobstructed breathing for granted. You don't realize how important it is until you can't do it!

In a recent sermon, I asked the question: "How can we make sure that the breaths we have between the one we are taking now and the last one we'll take will be used wisely?" I continue to ponder that question in my own heart. While we may think we have unlimited breaths, in our hearts we all know that someday we'll take our last one. I had the privilege of being with my dad when he died and watched as his breaths got fewer and farther in between. While most of the time we may not think about this ("Ugh, too morbid!"), Lent is a season for us to contemplate the finitude of our existence. From dust we have been made and to dust we shall return.

That story of our creation reminds me of this. In the beginning of Genesis, God forms Adam from the ground, gathering together the dust and the dirt and shaping it into a human being. But Adam wasn't alive until God breathed into him, infusing him with the breath of life that allowed Adam to inhale and exhale. From that point forward, every breath Adam took – just like every breath we take – is a gift from God.

Now, I don't expect that we'll literally use all our breaths in service to God. But symbolically, if we recognize the gift of life God has graciously granted us, it gives each breath a renewed significance. Each breath, each hour, each day, is an opportunity to serve God by sharing God's love and grace in this world. Often, when someone is trying to persuade another person who won't be swayed, the response is, "Don't waste your breath!" I wonder if God isn't saying the same thing to us?

This Lenten season, I want to encourage you to think about how you might use your breaths to get closer to God. Maybe it's slowing down your breaths to spend time in prayer or reading scripture. Maybe it's speeding up your breaths as you work to serve someone through volunteering. Maybe you use your breath to give voice to an issue that is causing you concern or to a cause that needs more advocacy.

Whatever you do, just being mindful of the value of each breath is a way to acknowledge our mortality and to draw us closer to God through praise and thanksgiving. We can breathe in the Spirit of God and breathe out the fears and anxieties that separate us from the One who reached down into the dirt to create us. However you choose to honor God, never forget that this life is the only one we have, and we are called to live in such a way that honors the God of each of us and the God of all of us. Don't waste your breath.

# STAR WORDS STORIES

I was really struck by the New Year sermon and the assignment of star words. I picked up "Believe." I am a fairly typical first child/type-A/Enneagram 1 so an 'assignment' works well for me. Also I tend to question things - maybe not all the way to doubt, but scratching around it. Having this word assigned to me and praying and reflecting on it has reminded me of my belief in God and God's belief in/love for me. But I really think it has reminded me to take this love and belief into my relationships with others. I am "believing" the best of people; my spouse, my teenager, my friends. If I'm tempted to stray into the spiral of "I don't know, what's the motivation behind something," I stop and think, "I believe in God and God's love for me - a very imperfect person, shown in the ultimate gift of Jesus." Then I try to reflect that love into my relationships by believing in them. It has been a small, subtle shift into a positive framework for 2024 - all anchored in my belief in God.

I have the star on my refrigerator, so it is something I see throughout the day, and it reminds me to connect with God - even just momentarily - and restate my belief.

# MARCH SERVICE PROJECT: NATALIE'S SISTERS AND THE WELL

In Lexington we have two agencies who assist victims of human trafficking by providing respite and referrals to community resources. These two agencies are <u>Natalie's Sisters</u> and <u>The Well</u>.

The Drop in service center at Natalie's Sisters offers a warm breakfast, healthy snack, nutritious lunch and referrals to community services for those in need.

The Well of Lexington provides a holistic program of safe housing, recovery support, education and healing for individuals exploited by sex and labor trafficking/exploitation. They keep children and youth from falling prey to traffickers by providing outreach programs to at-risk youth in the Lexington area.

Items requested below may be placed in the Giving Lane (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing), under the signs "Disciples Women's Ministries":


