

A WORD FROM KORY

I recently had lunch with a group of ministry colleagues and, as often happens when clergy get together these days, we started talking about the various challenges of doing church in this post-Covid era. We know the church has changed and things will never go

back to the way they used to be, yet we're still trying to figure out exactly how to lead the church into a future that is unprecedented.

The churches represented around the table varied greatly in size, worship style, regular attendance, etc. There were a lot of things we didn't have in common in how we lived out our call, but one thing we shared was our struggle to incorporate technology into the life of the church. We recognized that, just because you have a camera and a microphone and can livestream a worship service, doesn't mean that those who are tuning in feel like a part of the church community. How do you help someone move from passive watcher to participating worshipper when they aren't physically present in the sanctuary?

One of the examples we talked about was offering time. If someone worships with us online, we want to give them an opportunity to participate in the church's work and witness through giving, but does showing a QR code on the screen during worship disrupt the sacred feel of the service? Does it feel like too much of a money grab? And, while the offering is being collected, what should people at home see? A screen with some pictures and a QR code? Or the offering being collected in the (sometimes too empty) sanctuary? The first offers them a way to give but takes them "out" of the worship space, while the second keeps them in worship but doesn't allow them to participate. What's the right answer? As you can guess, there isn't one. Each church must decide for themselves what best fits their understanding of worship and the ways people are encouraged to participate.

Here at Crestwood I'm working with the Technology Team to figure out how to enhance our online worship experience without disrupting the feel of the service. For example, we're working on a method to begin adding graphics to the screen. I believe it would increase the meaningfulness of the worship experience to be able to show the words of the hymns being sung, the scriptures being read, and the names of the people on the screen. This is certainly doable and adds to the

worship for those who are joining us remotely.

The lunch group also talked about the draw-backs of online worship. Each minister present said they knew of congregation members who would never be able to worship with their church were it not for the online capabilities. What a blessing! But we admitted that we also knew people who had the ability to be present physically each week but chose to stay home and worship online. That detracts significantly from the community aspect of our worship. The church family is meant to be together as much as we are able. When we choose not to attend, we are not only depriving ourselves of that embodied worship experience, we're depriving the rest of the church of our presence.

Online worship will no doubt continue to adapt and evolve as more technology becomes available, and churches like Crestwood will continue to enhance that experience the best that we are able, but nothing will ever replace the meaningfulness of sitting in the sanctuary on Sunday morning, hearing the music in person, seeing the smiling faces, and receiving the word and the communion elements "in the flesh." It's the difference between listening to a song on the radio and seeing it performed in concert. There's no comparison.

So, if you are not able to attend worship at Crestwood on Sundays, we're more than pleased to offer you an online option so that you can stay connected to your church family. We're averaging about 103 views for our online worship (some watch live when it happens, but most watch it at some point during the week). We will continue to make that time of worship as meaningful as possible for you.

But, if you are able to come to worship in person on Sunday mornings, please make every effort to do so. We were meant to be together as the body of Christ, and, when you're here, it makes a difference. I hope to see you on Sunday!

My diagnosis with MS has surfaced challenges for me, both physically and mentally. **Persevere**. There are days when the fatigue and the aches and pains really limit my activity which depresses me, but if I stay focused on my goals and make the adjustments to work around them, I can still accomplish them. Can I do the high-impact boxing workout today? Maybe not, but I can do yoga. I can go for a walk. Maintaining an activity level improves my mood.

There are days at work where it seems like everything is going wrong and everyone is against me. The impression I get is that they don't think I can do the job. **Persevere**. Keep moving forward on our goals and efforts, recruit others to work with me to make the good things happen. Use the negatives to highlight the wins of the positives. Sometimes things take a little bit longer than I think they should, but I **persevere** with the course of action that I am confident is right.

Just the word **Persevere** has become a theme in my daily prayers. Keeping that word in mind helps me to ask for counsel, strength and empathy when working with myself and with others. It has a calming influence. Rather than going into anxiety, I head towards peace and comfort.


APRIL SRO TRIP
