A WORD FROM KORY



One of my favorite moments of the entire year is Commitment Sunday, which ends our Stewardship Campaign (but that's NOT why it's one of my favorite moments!). I love watching people come down the center aisle to put their pledges in the basket. Older people with walkers and canes, families with kids who

skip down the aisle, long-time members, people new to Crestwood who haven't even joined yet...everyone comes forward to make a commitment to God through our church.

I love watching it, because it symbolizes for me what a generous congregation this is. Each person who puts a card in the basket has a story to tell about why they give to Crestwood and the difference it makes for them. I'm privileged to know many of those stories, which makes the Commitment Sunday procession even more special to me. Each person in that line has made a conscious choice to give some of what they have for God's work.

That's not an easy decision to make, and it's one that shouldn't be taken lightly. The number of solicitations we get for donations seems to be growing every day. Our mailboxes are stuffed with appeal letters, our phones ring off the hook with calls from non-profit agencies. And then we read about a natural disaster or a person stricken with a rare disease and we add another donation to our list. That's why I'm so grateful for each person who gives to Crestwood.

I know there are a lot of questions surrounding non-profit organizations about how much of our donations actually get to those who need help the most. It's easy for large non-profits to earmark a significant percentage of donations for administrative costs. You think you're helping a starving child in Africa when you're actually paying a light bill or a CEO's salary. It's important to know to whom and to what you're giving.

I can promise you that 100% of your pledge to Crestwood goes to helping us fulfill our vision of connecting people to God and each other. For the purpose of transparency, I'll tell you that some of your pledge goes to pay salaries, pay utilities, and help with the upkeep of our campus, but each of those things is simply a means to an end of helping us be the church God is calling us to be.

The salaries you pay are for people who have dedicated themselves to welcoming people, helping them take the next steps on their faith journey, and caring for them. The utilities you pay help us open the doors, turn on the lights, and provide heat and air conditioning for non-profit groups to use our facilities at no charge. Thousands of people pass through our doors each year, finding help in their recovery, support for their ongoing struggles, or a sense of community and belonging on a sports team. The funds you provide for the upkeep of our buildings and grounds help us to offer a warm welcome to our members and guests.

Of course, your pledge also supports our various programs and ministries to children, youth, adults, and seniors. We strive to be good stewards of every dollar you give us, committing to give away up to 17.5% of our budget to local and world outreach programs. And we are blessed with a gifted Finance Team that oversees our money with a great sense of responsibility and an ear to the leading of God's Spirit.

You've hopefully already received the letter or email detailing the budgeting challenge for 2025. We are striving to honor our commitment to outreach and to pay our staff for the work they are doing, while continuing the excellent programs and ministries we offer. We are thinking a little bigger than we are, so we can grow into God's vision for us. We've welcomed 46 new members in the last year. God has an amazing future planned for us! To get there, we need your help.

I want to close with two words: Thank you! If you have decided to pledge to Crestwood for 2025, thank you! You make it possible for us to be the church God is calling us to be. If you haven't pledged, I would encourage you to join us on this grand adventure! A church our size cannot rely on a handful of people to fund its work. We need every person and family to pitch in to help us. Your gift, no matter how large or small, enables us to continue connecting people to God and each other. Thank you for being such generous stewards of the gifts God has given to you by sharing them with Crestwood. Together, we can truly make a difference...for the glory of God!

SRO TRIP TO CLAIBORNE HORSE FARM, TRACKSIDE RESTAURANT, AND HOPEWELL HISTORY MUSEUM IN BOURBON COUNTY

The day was perfect weather-wise, with blue skies, no wind, and 75 degrees! Our monthly SRO bus trip to Bourbon County was planned three months in advance, because we could visit Claiborne Horse Farm only by shuttle, which did not have seats for a crew of nine until late October! It turns out it was worth the wait. After enjoying lunch at Trackside Restaurant, the converted railroad depot in Paris, we boarded the bus again for a three-minute ride to Claiborne Farm. We got on the shuttle after a brief wait and began a drive around the 3,000 acre farm. The pastures, with grass cut every week, and the surrounding sycamore and oak trees lining the roads were beautiful. The driver drove slowly, stopping the shuttle every few minutes to relate the history of the farm, its owners, buildings, and the history of some of its horses. We were able to spend time with a few horses--a weanling and a filly race horse, but the new foals were with their mares on the far side of pastures.

We enjoyed sitting in the spacious, enclosed, outdoor seating area at Trackside Restaurant, where the service was quick and the food was great. Hopewell Museum was new to some of our group, while others had been there before. The one-floor exhibit space in the former post office covered many years of the history of Bourbon County, Paris, the agriculture there, and the contributions of the Black population. The Museum host welcomed us as visitors and waived the entry fee! Our group entirely enjoyed the day AND our substitute bus driver, Kelly Hale! See YOU next time.


