#### A WORD FROM KORY



Sunday, Nov. 24, was just about perfect. It was a day filled with joy, from the music in both services to the choir anthem to the overflowing children's time to (another!) family joining the church. And how about the representatives from the three organizations receiving grants from our Mildred F. Cox Endowment fund? I loved hearing their sincere

words of gratitude and the ways in which these funds will make real differences in their ministry.

Oh yeah, it was also my 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, but I'm so thankful the day wasn't all about me. Ministry is truly a gift that is meant to be shared, and what an honor to share that day with all that other joyous things taking place. I'm glad my celebration was only a small part of a much bigger day for Crestwood.

Still, I don't want to downplay my gratitude for those who helped make the day special for me personally. Thanks to my amazing team who helped plan and execute the reception after worship. Thanks to my dear friend, Michael Swartzentruber, who rushed over from his own church to be part of the festivities. Thanks to Doug Wilkinson for his kind words of appreciation (and not telling too many stories on me!).

For those of you who took time to write a card, send an email or text, or post on social media, I appreciate you more than words can say. I came home after worship and read each card, reflected on each memory, smiled at each picture drawn by our children. It's so humbling to think that I have played a small part in your journey of faith. I can promise you that you have played a huge part of my journey, both as a minister and as a person.

Fifteen years! How do you even capture what that time has meant, what all we've been through together, the changes we've seen, the tears we've cried (mostly mine!), the smiles we've shared. During our 15 years together, I've preached around 550 sermons, give or take a few (insert "sitting through sermon" joke here!). I have also performed or shared in performing:

- 27 weddings
- 134 Baptisms
- 70 Baby dedications
- 132 funerals

Think about that for a second. Each one of those numbers above represents a rite of passage, a significant moment in the life of a person or family. Think of the immense joy, the deep grief, the sense of pride, the hope for the future, the pain of loss. Those numbers are multitudes of life-changing moments, and you have granted me the privilege of standing with you as you've said, "I promise," as you've said, "I do," as you've said, "Goodbye."

Ministry is such a strange beast. It's incredibly hard work, unpredictable hours, sometimes thankless. It's also indescribably rewarding, satisfying at the soul level, and in its best moments, a glimpse of God's kin-dom here on earth. There have been some days when I was frustrated or angry. Even more days when I didn't think I was good enough. And a few days when I wanted to quit. Just like any job, I guess.

But there have been exponentially more days when I have simply marveled that I get to do this for a living and y'all even pay me! Days when I've held a newborn, or cried with a new widow, or watched a lightbulb go on in someone's eyes when they learn something new. Days when I've been inspired by your perseverance, in awe of your stubborn faithfulness, exceedingly proud of the ways you put your faith in action.

So, despite all the kind words of gratitude I've received recently, it is I that should be thanking you, Crestwood. Thank you for taking a chance on this 38-year-old minister with exactly one church under his belt. Thank you for welcoming my family and me, and for loving us through the years, even as my family fell apart, healed, changed. Thank you for letting me lead you, even when you weren't quite sure that I knew what I was doing. Thank you for showing me grace.

And thank you, God, for calling me to Crestwood. Thank you for letting me represent you, no matter how imperfectly I do it. Thank you for standing beside me and standing in the gap when I fall short. Thank you, God, for entrusting this extraordinary group of people to my care and leadership. It's been the greatest gift to serve them.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD NOTES

At its November meeting, the Administrative Board took several actions, including:

- Receiving a report from the Faithful Planning Team, which has begun its work. Congregational involvement in the process will begin in January.
- Amending the Endowment Fund Policy to (1) allow for 5% of the earned income over the course of 12 months to be contributed back to the principal to help grow the fund, and to (2) allow for 10% of the earned income over the course of 12 months to be given to the Finance Committee for use in the preparation of the general operating budget.
- Recommending to the congregation for approval a balanced budget for 2025, which includes, among other things, an Outreach percentage of 10% and moving Missy and Steph to full-time employment status.

Dear Crestwood family. The Finance Committee and Administrative Board present to you the Budget for 2025. To honor the hard work and energy that Missy and Steph lavish upon our congregation, especially our children and youth, the Personnel Team recommends moving them both to full-time positions. Of course, this impacts the budget we have developed, so this year's budget is larger than 2024's. While the number of pledging families has increased, the dollar amount those pledges represent are just a bit less than the funds requested. However, a balanced budget has been achieved, which still provides nearly all of what was requested and keeps the outreach percentage at 10%. Please read through this budget carefully, and bring your questions with you to the upcoming church-wide session on December 15th.

Their work plan includes collecting relevant information and data, as well as gathering input from several groups, including the congregation, local outreach organizations, and groups that use the Mission Center. The team will focus on these activities during the months of December and January. After all the information and input are collected, the team will spend a significant amount of time making sense of the data, which will inform a possible revision of the church's vision and mission and development of strategic/key areas to be addressed in a strategic plan. The next step will be the identification of strategic goals.

The team hopes that church members will participate in the opportunities to provide input. More information will be available soon.

Residents farm the land to offer nature-based healing, nutritious farm-to-table produce and job training for survivors. Specially trained crisis counselors are available to help survivors 24 hours each day and 365 days a year for crisis intervention and stabilization through individual and group counseling, as well as assisting with children's services.
