REV. DR. DENISE BELL TO PREACH MAY 4

Rev. Dr. Denise Bell is the Donald and Lillian Nunnelly Chair and Assistant Professor of Pastoral Leadership at Lexington Theological Seminary. For 35 years, she served churches as pastor, associate, senior associate, satellite pastor, interim pastor, and executive pastor. As an educator and minister of practice, Dr. Bell seeks to help pastors and congregations increase their capacity to flourish and to be healthy communities of faith in a changing world. As a church leader, her enthusiasm in ministry comes from her excitement in seeing lives and churches transformed



by fresh ideas and boldness. You won't want to miss the word she has for us!

A WORD FROM KORY



There's something going on at Crestwood. Can you feel God's spirit moving? Almost 600 people on Easter Sunday, including 75 kids. The next Sunday, in front of over 300 people, we baptized fourteen of our youth (with three more to be baptized on May 4). Our first young adult gathering had 14 people and monthly gatherings will start in March. We

have new members joining on a regular basis and we're seeing more guests each Sunday than ever before. An increasing number of people are engaged and participating in our fellowship events and outreach opportunities. We are poised to take the next step in answering God's call at Crestwood.

That's why our Faithful Planning process is so important and well-timed. The team should finish their work in the next month or so and present that to the Administrative Board in July. The result will be a set of goals to help us pursue our vision and mission with concrete action steps. I'm so excited to see what comes out of this team's hard work.

As you may remember, part of the process was a congregational survey about our vision and mission, and an evaluation of the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats, and aspirations (SWOT-A) of our congregation. The results were quite enlightening and helpful to the team as we continue our work. I want to share some of those results with you now.

We had 106 responses, ranging in age from 11 to 88, with an average responder age of 59. About a third of the responders had children, and about 75% attend the second service (the rest either attend the 8:30 AM service or worship online). When asked about how well we are living out the mission and vision, here are the responses to how well we are living those out. The percentage at the end represents the number of people who rated this either 4 (well) or 5 (extremely well).

- Vision Connecting people to God and each other (80%)
- Mission Welcome and accept all people (88%)
- Mission Invite people to ask questions about how faith and life intersect (76%)
- Mission Encourage people to take the next step in their faith journey (81%)
- Mission Care for each other and the stranger (89%)
- Mission Serve God by serving others (94%)

We learned that there is some confusion around the "encourage people" statement and that there is an overlap in meaning between the last two statements.

The next part of the survey asked people to rank their top SWOT-A responses. Here are the results (with the percentage of people who ranked these in the top 3):

Strengths

- Worship/sermons are inclusive and/or interesting (all are welcome, the table is for everyone) (62%)
- Children's Ministry & Programs (50%)
- There is respect for all levels of one's faith journey, an atmosphere open to dialogue and questions (35%)

Weaknesses

- College student/young adults (63%)
- Intergenerational connections (44%)
- Committee and volunteer participation (30%)

Opportunities

- Stronger and bigger youth programs, young adult ministry, parents' ministry (49%)
- Growth in membership (43%)
- Sunday school programs and participation (41%)

Threats

- People not going to church (58%)
- Competing interests for time (i.e., sports) (51%)
- Aging congregations combined with declining membership (42%)

Aspirations

- More members involved in outreach and volunteering (47%)
- Consistent funding for outreach (43%)
- More programming for high school and college students/young adults (41%)

So, what did the team do with these results? They took this information and data gathered from other groups (church leadership and staff, groups that use the mission center, organizations served by our Local Outreach team) and came up with a set of five themes: Internal Engagement, External Engagement, Exploring Diversity, Telling Our Story, and Growth. Our next step is to meet with congregational leaders to review the mission and vision and to put concrete goals and action steps to each of these themes. I can't wait to see how God's spirit leads us forward into the future as we strive to be the church God has called us to be. Stay tuned for more, I believe what God has planned for us is even bigger than we can imagine!




after both worship services. Please make plans to stay a few minutes after worship to connect with your Crestwood family.



MAY SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE: THE NATHANIEL MISSION

The Nathaniel Mission is one of Lexington's oldest agencies. It was formed in 1940 stemming from a need to serve community members living in the neighborhoods on the Versailles Road corridor. The Mission provides both spiritual support as well as tangible services to families living in this area. The mission has grown to support a variety of services and it casts a much wider net in order to reach more neighborhoods in need.
