

A WORD FROM KORY



I hope you've had a chance to look over the Faithful Plan that was received by the Board at their called meeting in August. It's an ambitious, transformative plan that will shape the future of our congregation in profound ways. I couldn't be more excited about it and can't wait to start living it out (the Board will appoint an Implementation

Team at its September meeting to make that happen). I want to use this space to talk a little more about how the plan came about and what it means for us.

Before the plan gets into strategies and goals, it addresses two identity issues. The first is that it puts forward a set of values that help define who we are. They are:

- Welcoming: We are a friendly and inclusive faith community, living out the limitless love of Christ as a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world.
- Authenticity: We are genuine with each other as we put our faith into action. We recognize that each of us is a work in progress and we honor the image of God in each other.
- **Generosity**: We cheerfully give of our resources, including our finances, time, and use of facilities.
- **Engagement**: Every person is called to use their gifts to serve God and minister to others.
- Curiosity: We invite questions and encourage exploration as a way of growing in our faith.
- Commitment to Outreach: We serve beyond the walls of the church.

These values bubbled up through the pages and pages of data we collected from over 150 participants. I feel like they capture the heart of Crestwood and help us articulate why we do what we do.

The other identity piece is the plan streamlines our Mission Statement. Our old statement had five bullet points, but we learned through our surveys that a couple of those points were confusing. Our new statement is more succinct and clearer on who God is calling us to be. It reads:

 Mission: Connecting people to God and each other by welcoming and accepting everyone; helping them grow in their faith; and empowering them to serve God by serving others. I love this new statement because it balances the call to bring people in, disciple them, and send them out, taking the church out into the world.

The plan itself consists of four strategies, each with three goals. They are:

Strategy: Internal Engagement - Grow and strengthen the congregation by helping members find personally meaningful ways to minister to one another.

- Goal 1: Develop administrative tools to support increased congregational engagement.
- Goal 2: Increase participation in key programs.
- Goal 3: Invest in leadership development.

With this strategy, our hope is to help the congregation members live out their God-given gifts to connect with God and each other and serve God both inside and outside the church. We have a lot of exciting things going on and we want people to be part of them. This strategy will help us connect the congregation with opportunities to get involved.

Strategy: External Engagement - Expand our impact on the community and the world by engaging more members in outreach efforts.

- Goal 1: Develop administrative tools to support increased community engagement.
- Goal 2: Conduct an assessment of our current external engagement activities to minimize duplication and maximize involvement and impact.
- Goal 3: Grow member participation in external engagement activities.

This strategy is similar to the first one, but it focuses more on the ways we use our gifts to serve our community. Commitment to outreach is a core value for us and this strategy helps us live that out by making sure we are using our gifts and resources for a maximum impact.

Strategy: Telling our Story - Improve the ways we communicate with both members and non-members about Crestwood's ministry.

Goal 1: Develop a communications plan.

- Goal 2: Explore and utilize selected communications platforms, based on communications plan.
- Goal 3: Show appreciation for all who serve.

We have such a great story to tell, one of welcome and grace and service. In our world today, telling that story means being conversant in a variety of communication platforms. This strategy will help us make use of the communication tools available to connect people to God and each other, shining Christ's light as we tell and show the ways God is at work through us.

Strategy: Be Intentionally Inclusive - Follow Christ's example by showing God's limitless love to all.

- Goal 1: Explore how Crestwood can create a more welcoming environment to all people.
- Goal 2: Explore the process to seek designation as an *Open and Affirming* congregation, showing our public commitment to the full inclusion of LGBTQ+ people in the life and ministry of our church.

Goal 3: Create a welcoming and inclusive environment at Crestwood for guests, regardless of their church.

This strategy came through loud and clear from our congregation as something that is extremely important to them. Our world is growing more diverse all the time, and yet there are forces pushing back against that. We believe God honors that diversity, and this strategy will help us welcome and embrace the beautiful rainbow of God's creativity. In a world where lines are drawn and people are being shut out, we want to be a place that welcomes people in, just as Christ welcomes us.

This plan calls us forward into a future drenched in God's grace and love, and our call is simply to be faithful to it. Some of the goals are already being addressed and I expect you'll be hearing more about others in the near future. The Implementation Team will work on timing and prioritization of these goals. I hope you are as excited about them as I am! I can't wait to see the ways God's spirit works through us as we live into this plan. God has BIG plans for us!

SEPTEMBER SRO BUS TRIP TO FRANKFORT

Let's look for cooler weather in early September when the next SRO bus trip leaves for Frankfort! We will be on the road again on Tuesday, Sept. 9, so RSVP time is now! We start with a driveby/drive-through to see the



Floral Clock near the front of the State Capitol, the spectacular Vietnam Memorial sundial clock that lists the names of all Kentucky fatalities during the Vietnam conflict. Next, we will drive through the Frankfort Cemetery, where several notable historical Kentuckians are buried. (At any of these sites we may get off the bus for a closer look). Then, it will be time for lunch at The Brown Barrel in downtown Frankfort. After lunch, we will go to the Kentucky History Center for a tour of exhibit highlights and the "Gallery Exploration." The old State Capitol is now part of the History Center tour. Usually open to the public, it is temporarily closed due to air conditioning issues, but is open for scheduled tours like ours. HELP US CARE FOR EACH OTHER


