## A WORD FROM KORY



Y'all know I'm a word nerd. I love nothing more than to take a word, break it down, and examine its parts. Language is such a fascinating invention that is always evolving, and we have so much to learn about how we communicate with each other. For example, each year dozens of new words are added to the dictionary to keep up with our

changing language. This year's Word of the Year? "Six seven." Don't ask me to explain it, I don't know what it means, either.

One of my favorite suffixes (OK, what kind of nerd has a favorite SUFFIX?) is "-rupt," which means to break. Think of all the words that contain this suffix and how they so aptly describe our world today:

- Disrupt to cause disorder or turmoil in
- Corrupt guilty of dishonest practices
- Interrupt to cause or make a break in the continuity or uniformity of
- Bankrupt completely lacking in a particular quality or value
- Abrupt sudden or unexpected
- Rupp Arena home court of a basketball team I hope isn't breaking

And then, of course, there's the word "rupture," which means "to break or burst suddenly." Our world has been ruptured. The civility of our society has been ruptured. Our sense of decency and the fabric of our community have been ruptured. Our trust in authority and our ability to be genuine and vulnerable with each other have been ruptured.

But there's one more "-rupt" word, one that we don't use very often. In fact, I had never heard of it until a few years ago. The word is "irrupt." To irrupt is "to break into." It's not like "erupt," which is to break out of, or "interrupt," which is to break into the middle of. What does it mean for something to irrupt?

Imagine you've come to church on Christmas Eve, ready to celebrate the most holy night of the year. A big crowd has gathered but the doors aren't open yet. As the crowd grows, so does the anticipation. And then, the doors are opened wide and the crowd rushes into the church, filling all the space with joy and laughter and singing. That's an irruption.

As we approach the start of Advent, a time when we remember that our corrupt, disrupted, bankrupt world is in need of a savior, the incarnation is an irruption. Christ irrupted into our mundane lives as a baby in a manger, disrupting the status quo, corrupting the power structure, interrupting the narrative about who matters and who doesn't. God irrupted into our world, breaking into the chaos of our lives with a still small voice to remind us that our brokenness does not define us. We were created to be whole in God's eyes.

And Christ still irrupts into our world today, surprising us with grace and insight and that fleeting glimpse of God's handiwork. Just when we think this world is not salvageable, we hear stories about people living out their compassion, folks showing generosity in order to change lives, people of different colors and beliefs and identities coming together to make a difference, children leading powerful worship services. When we live out our faith in tangible ways, Christ irrupts among us all over again.

In fact, that happens every Sunday. When we come to the table, we remember that Christ's body was ruptured for us. His body was broken so that we might know wholeness in our hearts and in our communities. Every time we rupture the bread, Christ irrupts once again among us.

I pray this Christmas season is a season of irruption for you, as Christ breaks into your life with new insights, surprising grace, and a reminder of God's unending love for you. In a season when we feel constantly interrupted, disrupted and bankrupt, may we remember that Christ will irrupt in our lives once again so that we may know the fullness of his love for us.




items will be donated to local nonprofits. Thank you for warming the hearts of our neighbors this holiday season.

That one in every four children in Kentucky faces food insecurity? Or that over 700,000 people in our state go hungry on a regular basis? Our Blessing Box, which is stocked daily by our Blessing Box Team, provides nutritious, non-perishable food items to many folks who might not be able to eat otherwise. ## **CRESTWOOD ENDOWMENT GRANT AWARDS 2025**

The Crestwood Endowment Fund is comprised of three separate accounts: the Cox Endowment Account, the Legacy Endowment Account, and the Paul Hunt Bowman account. The Cox account was created following a bequest from Mildred Farr Cox and is designated for Outreach giving to fund capital projects exceeding \$20K. The Legacy account is available for use by Crestwood at the request of the Finance Committee, and the Paul Hunt Bowman fund supports ministerial educational pursuits. You may recall that last fall Crestwood was able to use the growth from the Cox account investment to fund grant applications from Christian Care Communities, The Lexington Rescue Mission, and New Life Day Center.

The investments in the Cox account have continued to perform well this year and generated sufficient growth so that Local and World Outreach committees were able to release grant applications again. In collaboration with the Endowment Committee and with approval from the Administrative Board, Crestwood is funding the following grants for a total of \$229,890:

- Christian Church in KY (World Outreach) \$50,000 for improvements to Camp Wakon 'Da- Ho. Camp Wakon'Da-Ho is in Casey County and is where the Disciples of Christ Youth and Children attend church camp.
- **Natalie's Sisters** (Local Outreach) \$27,750 for repairs and upgrades to two of Natalie's Sisters facilities. Natalie's Sisters provides services to trafficked and exploited women.
- **Arbor Youth Services** (Local Outreach) \$56,140 to complete critical safety and accessibility improvements for minor and young adult shelters. Arbor Youth Services provides for homeless and at-risk youth.
- The Nest (Local Outreach) \$96,000 to remodel a kitchen to a fully equipped commercial kitchen allowing for expansion of community outreach and educational services. The Nest provides services to prevent the abuse and neglect of children and adults by supporting families in crisis through education, counseling, advocacy, and resources.

What a blessing it is for Crestwood to have this opportunity to build upon our strong history of Outreach and to provide for the community in such a significant way. I look forward to the ways that Crestwood Christian Church can continue to live out our Vision and Mission by connecting People to God and one another and serving our community.

## DECEMBER SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE: THE NEST

The Nest is an agency that has been serving the Lexington area since 1977. It is a lifeline for all individuals and families in crisis, facing adversity, or who have unexpected needs. The



Nest provides caregivers with equal access to high quality child care providers, personal hygiene necessities and various items that support a healthy and safe environment for infants and children. Parenting classes are provided to female and male caregivers focusing on quality parenting skills. The Nest also provides counseling for intimate partner violence in both individual and group settings as well as legal advocacy for survivors.

Donations to support the mission of The Nest include:

- -Car seats (must be unexpired and have never been in a wreck)
- -In-season children's clothing (gently used, clean, and free of stains or tears)
- -Baby equipment (cribs, pack-n-plays, strollers, highchairs, bouncers, etc.)
- -Infant care items (sippy cups, etc.)
- -Infant formula (unopened and unexpired)
- -Diapers and wipes


