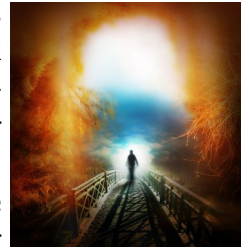

A WORD FROM KORY



In the passage from John 1 where Jesus calls his disciples, there's an interesting progression. John the Baptist points to Jesus, which leads two disciples to follow Jesus. They ask Jesus a question ("Where are you staying?") and he invites them to "Come and see."

They do, and they are so awestruck by what they see they reach out to their friends. Phillip reaches out to Nathanael, and while he's skeptical ("Can anything good come from Nazareth?") he also "comes and sees" and ends up becoming a disciple of Jesus. We can presume that Nathanael offered the invitation to someone else, who offered it to someone else, until eventually someone offered it to us. Come and see.

How did you find Crestwood? That was the question I posed to our Men's Breakfast group last Saturday. It was a great mix of sixteen guys from all different walks of life and different tenures at Crestwood. As we went around the table, each told a story about how they ended up at Crestwood.

One of them was born into the church, so I guess he really didn't have much choice! But what's interesting about his story is that he came back after college and some time away. Another grew up in the neighborhood, attending Glendover Elementary, and the church was a part of his weekly rhythm. And two of us came to Crestwood because y'all paid us! Bill McDonald and I thank you for that.

Other stories were more unconventional. One man came to Crestwood after leaving his church of several decades over a clash with new leadership and direction. He found Crestwood and invited a friend, and both of them were at the men's breakfast. Another came because he moved to town and a relative already attended. Yet another found us after moving to Lexington from a town out west which also had a Crestwood Christian Church which he attended. Coincidence or divine providence?

And then there were a few who found us through more modern methods. Several of them watched a few worship services online and decided to give us a try. One of them had only first visited the church the Sunday before the breakfast, but wanted to come and meet more people. I sat back and just soaked in all the different ways people made their way to Crestwood.

There was a common thread in all their diverse stories. Each person said that once they stepped inside the doors of the church, they felt welcomed. People made an effort to smile at them, to greet them, to learn their name. They felt like they were seen as people, not potential members or donors. After the breakfast, I saw one of the young adults inviting the new visitor (also a young adult) to our young adult gathering the next Wednesday. Come and see.

How did you get to Crestwood? Maybe you were born into it, maybe you first came with your parents, maybe it was geographically convenient. You might have scoped out the website or watched a few sermons online. You might have a friend who invited you and you accepted the invitation. However it happened, you're here. And I'm really glad you are!

As we start 2026, there are going to be a lot of people who are looking. Looking for meaning. Looking for purpose. Looking for hope. Looking for a church that welcomes them, accepts them, grounds them in God's love, calls them to discover and live out their gifts. They may be disillusioned with their current church or gave up on church a long time ago. And they're waiting for a simple invitation: Come and see.

And some of them will. They'll walk through our doors, look around, and wonder if they belong. And then you'll catch their eye and walk up to them and say, "Welcome. I'm really glad you're here." Or they'll sit next to you in the pew, hesitantly wondering if they're sitting in someone else's seat, and you'll lean over and say, "We've been saving that spot for you! Welcome to Crestwood."

Our church is growing, not just in numbers or dollars, but in significance in people's lives and in our relevance to the community. Each person who comes into our church changes us because they add their gifts to ours, like every drop of water changes how much water there is in a glass. God is going to reach out to them in a variety of ways: through friends and family, through geographic proximity, through a YouTube Channel. And all you have to do is one thing: See them. Acknowledge them. Welcome them. Just like someone did for you when you first came to Crestwood.

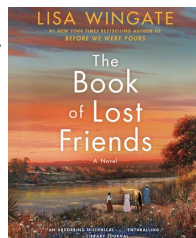
LET'S MAKE A SOUPER DIFFERENCE

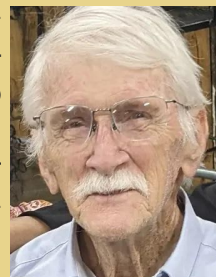

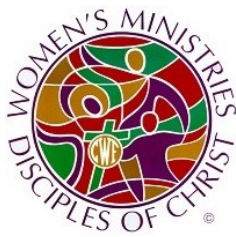
