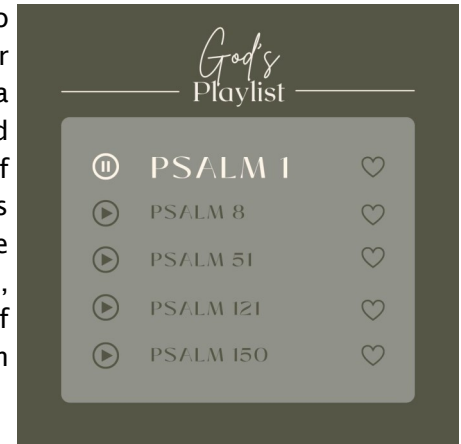

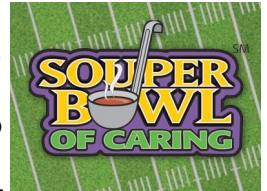
## LENTEN SERMON SERIES

## A WORD FROM KORY



One of my favorite purchases for my new apartment is my floor lamp. Yes, I'm easily pleased. This lamp is cool because the light emanates from two half-circles that can be rotated at any angle. So, if you angle them up, it's a room light. If you angle them down, it becomes a reading light. If you're undecided, you can angle one up and one down. You

change the angles, the brightness, even the warmth of the light to suit your mood.

I was thinking about that lamp when I read this saying that a friend sent me earlier this week: "Early this morning, there was fog and as the sun rose around us everything began to glow. It made me wonder what this world will become for us when we remember in our bones that even the darkness is just another shape of light."

This struck me, because I often think of darkness as the opposite of light, a shadowy contrast to a sunny presence. Darkness and light. I see their relationship as antithetical, not complementary. One is the absence of the other, not another form or shape of it. I wonder how my perspective of darkness changes if I see it as another shape of light?

One commentator wrote, "It is a call and response for me lately with darkness proposing the things it hopes will distract me. Fear and fragments and cynicism and fatigue, among others (also, on a more mundane level, ice and snow). My response is choosing every morning to love my life and the people in it, choosing to see how everything leads toward understanding even when I don't see it right away. Choosing the possibility, no matter how ephemeral or quiet, of a world that works for everyone, no exceptions. That's the light I keep on the lookout for."

My first response was to balk at this statement. DOES the world work for everyone? The people in detention centers? The unhoused huddled to keep warm in the snow? The newly retired person diagnosed with terminal cancer? I wrinkled my nose, thinking that the writer was a bit too naïve, too Pollyanna-ish, to see the darkness in the world for what it is. When someone shows you who they really are, believe them. And this world is dark.

But what if that darkness is just another shape of light, light that has been bent, distorted, refracted in such a way that it illuminates the evil within and around us, calls forth from the shadows the selfishness and greed and fear that resides in each of us (not just the people we don't like)? What if the light is still there, shining in the darkness, not necessarily overcoming it but also not giving into it?

If we really think about it, we know this in our bones, don't we? We're reminded every Christmas Eve, when we light our multitude of candles from the one Christ candle and hold them aloft, driving back the darkness of the sanctuary, lighting up God's house with the glow. When we leave that evening, the world is still dark, but the birth of Christ gives it a new shape, a new sense of hope. And gives us a new sense of purpose. The candle may be extinguished, but the light glows on.

For some reason, God has brought into my path a number of people lately who are wrestling with darkness. People struggling with addiction, broken relationships, depression, a lack of motivation and purpose. And yet, God has also shown me people who are shining their light, who are not letting the darkness overcome them. In many cases, it's the same person wrestling with the darkness who is also shining the light. It just takes a different shape.

In one of the strangest contradictions in the Bible, Jesus says, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12) but also says, "You are the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). Well, Jesus, which is it? Are you the light or are we the light? I have a feeling Jesus would say, "Yes." We are all the light, just in different shapes. Even when humanity is at its darkest, the light of Christ still shines within us.

My prayer for you is that you never lose perspective on the light that shines in and around you. This world feels so dark right now. And yet, we can choose the possibility that, no matter how ephemeral or quiet, the world works for everyone. Or, as Paul says it in Romans 8, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him." ALL things. Even the darkest ones.

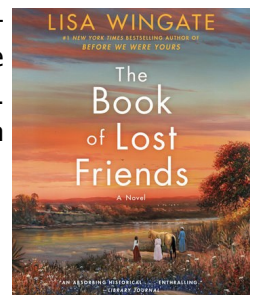
## JOIN US FOR THE WALK FOR WARMTH

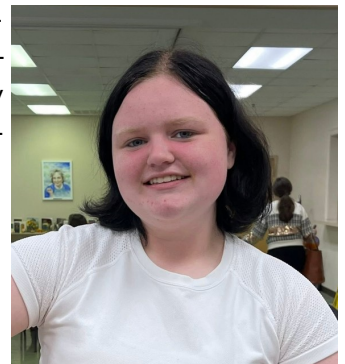

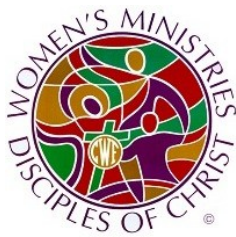

### FEBRUARY SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE: GREENHOUSE 17

Greenhouse 17 is a non-profit organization committed to ending intimate partner abuse in families in the community. The shelter is located on a 40 acre farm in rural Fayette County and serves individuals and families in 17 counties.



Residents farm the land for nature based healing, nutritious farm to table produce and job training. Specially trained crisis counselors are available to help survivors twenty-four hours a day 365 days a year providing crisis intervention and stabilization through individual and group counseling as well as assisting with children's services.

Greenhouse 17 is requesting the following NEW/UNUSED supplies to support the lives of survivors:

- Disinfecting wipes
- Lightly scented or unscented body wash
- Lysol all-purpose cleaner
- 55-60 gallon trash bags
- Laundry detergent
- Toilet paper
- Bath towels and wash cloths
- Underwear of all sizes (toddler to adult)

## BOARD NOTES

At its Jan. 21 regular meeting, the Administrative Board took several actions:

- Approved the Consent Agenda and corresponding reports
- Received the treasurer's report, which included the good news that our pledged giving in 2025 finished \$31,700 ahead of budget
- Received the Implementation Team's report about its progress in carrying out the Faithful Plan approved last August
- Approved a change in outreach distribution from the general operating budget. Now, 46% will go to Disciples Mission Fund, 27% will go to Local Outreach, and 27% will go to World Outreach. The LTS Scholarship will now be funded from the earned income of the Paul Hunt Bowman Fund.
- Approved a staff restructuring proposal to not move forward with the hiring of an associate minister, but instead to hire a part-time youth minister, a full-time minister for children and families, and to increase the hours of the part-time minister for pastoral care.
