A WORD FROM KORY



While Lent is supposed to be a season of slowing down for contemplation and introspection, it feels like we are picking up speed here at Crestwood. Here are a few things going on for which we can thank God:

- We've started this year's Pastor's Class with 10 kids, five of whom are from families who haven't even joined yet!
- We had 16 people at our first book discussion of John Fugelsang's "The Separation of Church and Hate." It's not too late to join!
- Our sermon series and Sunday School focus on the Psalms is underway with great feedback

These are just a few of things we have going on here to help us move through this season of Lent with intentionality and focus. Our goal is to arrive at Holy Week and Easter with a renewed sense of the magnitude of Christ's sacrifice to us and the gift he gave us by dying on the cross.

I shared all that we have going on at church with my spiritual director, who paused and said, "Wow, that sounds like a lot. So, how you are making space to listen to God in the midst of all that?" Tough question, because I'm the kind of person who does a lot of speaking but probably not enough listening, especially when it comes to God. I just LOVE telling God about all that I have going on, but I don't always create room for God to talk back.

So, she challenged me. What would it look like to make space for God to speak? Of course, to do that means I have to be silent, not my strongest suit. But for Lent, I'm trying to do just that. When my alarm goes off in the morning, I'm sitting up and being silent for 10 minutes, doing my best to calm my mind and to attune myself to God's voice. Sometimes I'll repeat a mantra like, "Holy God, speak to me" or "Lord Jesus, thank you for your gift."

Sounds great, doesn't it? Well, don't be too impressed. Half the time I fall back asleep. Other times, I start making a to-do list in my mind that I plan on writing down as soon as those 10 minutes are up. Sometimes, I don't make it the full 10 minutes because I'm too anxious to get the day started. So far, I feel like I've completely failed at this task.

But isn't the endeavor to be faithful a losing effort to begin with? From Adam and Eve onward, we humans have failed miserably at being faithful to God. One of my seminary professors said the Bible in one sentence is, "God's constant faithfulness in the face of humanity's constant disobedience." Sounds about right. It's not that we don't have good intentions. I really want to be more faithful, to be a better listener. But sometimes, I'm too sleepy or have too much to do.

Thankfully, God has infinite patience with us and knows us better than we know ourselves. After all, that's why we have Jesus. God knew we couldn't be completely faithful, so rather than punish us for falling short, God gave us Jesus as a way to say, "I love you, not in spite of your humanness, but because of it." And what did we do with that gift? We hung it on a cross. I feel like sometimes God's only response to us is the emoji of the guy smacking himself in the forehead.

I'm come to learn that accepting my failure as a follower of Christ is a prerequisite to being a better follower of Christ. What I mean by that is that, when I accept that I'm not always going to put those 10 minutes of silence to the best use, I free myself up from the expectations I put on myself to be a better Christian. Sometimes, I fall back to sleep. Most times, I'm distracted, but every once in awhile, if I'm quiet enough, God has something to say.

This faith thing is hard. And I know lots of people who've given up because there aren't always immediate returns on our investment. We worship and we pray and we give and we don't get anything in return. But I think God would say, "Hey, dear child, it's not about you." It's about God, about giving to God what God has already given to us in such abundance that our cups brim with blessings – our time, our attention, our money. I hope – and I recognize this may be a rationalization, but it works for me – that God pays more attention to my heart than my ability to execute my plans. Hey, God, I'm doing my best. And, in reality, I pray that's enough. Even if I fall asleep during that prayer.


MARCH MEN'S BREAKFAST




CRESTWOOD BOOK CLUB

LET'S BUILD CRESTWOOD'S 41ST HABITAT HOUSE!

Spring is almost upon us and it is time to build another Habitat for Humanity house. Each year Crestwood Christian Church joins with the other Disciples of Christ churches in Lexington to build a home for a deserving family. What a great tradition! This will be Crestwood's 41st house (Lexington's Disciples for Habitat's 43rd house). Through this effort, we have built more houses than any other group in Lexington. This year, the Disciples for Habitat will be once again co-sponsoring the house with downtown Lexington churches and synagogues in an effort called the Faith Build.

This year's homeowner is Charysia and her three daughters. She and her children are so excited to get their new Habitat home. The house will provide space for the kids to enjoy as they grow up in a safe, stable environment. For the last 12 years they have lived in a two-bedroom apartment, high rent, maintenance not responsive. Charysia has worked at Baptist Health for more than 10 years.



As a co-sponsor of a house, Disciples for Habitat contributes funds for the materials. This past year, Crestwood raised \$17,680 as our share of the costs. Not everyone is able to physically work on building a house, but everyone can be a part of this vital program by contributing financially. Our goal for this year is to raise \$23,333. With the increase in the cost of home building, this financial support is essential. We will be seeking donations during the month of March. To make a contribution, checks should be made out to Crestwood Christian Church with the word "Habitat" in the memo line; or place cash in a pew envelope and write your name and the word "Habitat" on the outside. In making an online donation to Crestwood's Habitat fund select Donation/Payment and indicate the purpose is for Habitat.

The dates for Phase 1 of the construction are tentatively April 7, 8, 9, 10, 16, 17, 23, 24, 30 and May 1. If you would like to volunteer please register with Jordan Amis [here](#) and choose Faith Build. Or just show up at 785 Harrison Trace between 8:30 AM-3:30 PM. The house will be a 1600 square foot, one story, 4 bedroom, 2 bath home with garage. No matter the skill level there is a job for everyone. Together we can build a safe, affordable home for a deserving family.



MARCH SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE: NATALIE'S SISTERS AND THE WELL OF LEXINGTON



In Lexington, we have two agencies that assist victims of human trafficking by providing respite and referrals to community resources. These two agencies are Natalie's Sisters and The Well of Lexington.

Natalie's Sisters offers a warm breakfast, healthy snack, nutritious lunch and referrals to community services to those in need. The Well of Lexington provides a holistic program of safe housing, recovery support, education and healing for individuals exploited by sex and labor trafficking/exploitation. They keep children and youth from falling prey to traffickers by providing outreach programs to at-risk youth in the Lexington area.

CRESTWOOD ENDOWMENT FUND GIVING

You are likely aware of the bequest from Mildred Farr Cox a few years ago that allowed for the establishment of a Crestwood Endowment Fund dedicated to Outreach giving. On Sunday, February 15 you witnessed the real-life impact of this fund as we awarded grants to four agencies totaling almost \$230K.

Recently, Crestwood has been the beneficiary of end-of-life gifts from several other long-time, devoted congregation members that have added to the base investment of this fund. The Endowment Committee is working to establish and recognize a core "group" that has already graced Crestwood with an end-of-life gift or has plans to do so. All such gifts will be placed in our endowment fund, from which only the annual income will be used to support Crestwood ministries for generations to come.
