A WORD FROM KORY



I never planned on being a minister. I didn't grow up going to church regularly, so I had no concept of what it meant to be a minister. The only ones I knew were old white guys with gray hair who you never saw without a suit and tie or a robe. I never saw a minister on the golf course or at Kroger or anywhere that "normal" people went. For me, ministers were other-worldly.

That changed when my home church, First Christian Church in Jeffersonville, IN, which I started attending during college, called a new minister. Bruce was younger, had been divorced, played golf, and asked me to housesit when he and his wife went on vacation. Oh, and preached on Sunday. It was the first time I met a minister who was also a real human being. And at that point, God planted a seed.

It took a while for that seed to germinate. At the time, I was attending Ohio University, working on my Masters in Interpersonal Communication with the intention of moving on to do a PhD and teach college. The summer after finishing my master's degree, I was back in Jeffersonville helping lead Vacation Bible School. One evening, while lamenting a return to Ohio to start my PhD, Bruce's wife said, "You should just go to seminary instead." I laughed. Me? A minister? Ridiculous!

But on the drive home, a light went off. Not a bright flash; more like a match lit in the darkness. The next day, I met with Bruce and said, "This is going to sound crazy, but I'm thinking about seminary." His response? "I've been waiting for you to come into my office and say that." I talked with my mom and my fiancée about this crazy notion, both of whom were supportive.

And then, I talked with my friend, Kevin. Kevin was the best man in my wedding and a friend for many years. Kevin was also a "church survivor," someone who had been hurt by the church and vowed never to step foot in one again. I was nervous to tell him about this career change, so after I haltingly shared it with him, I braced for his reaction. "Dude, that's a natural for you! You should do it!" It was a moment of divine confirmation for me. Four years later, at my ordination, Kevin was in the church to celebrate with me.

I went to seminary in 1997, a week after getting married, and spent four years learning how to be a minister. I did my student ministry at Carmel United Church Christ and North Christian Church in Columbus, IN, where I learned the good, the bad, and the ugly of what it REALLY meant to be a minister. Also, it was in my last semester of my final year when I was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis, which changed both my life and my approach to ministry. It was a few months later that I was ordained on May 20, 2001, and began my ministry in June at Community Christian Church in Lincolnshire, IL.

It's hard for me to believe that was 25 years ago. In some ways it feels like last month; in others, it feels like several lifetimes. After eight years in Lincolnshire (three as associate pastor and five as senior pastor), Crestwood called me in 2009 to come to Lexington, where I've been for over 16 years. I have had the privilege of walking through life with you, from baby dedications and baptisms to weddings and funerals. And LOTS of sermons! And you have walked with me through my own personal triumphs, tragedies, and life changes.

As I look back, I wouldn't change a thing. Everything that has happened to me, from the divine (I owe all that to God) to the disastrous (sometimes of my own doing!), is a part of my story and has made me the minister and man I am today. Answering the call to ministry was one of the best decisions I ever made and I don't regret a second of it. It's not always been easy, and there are days I would be glad to be doing something else, but what I feel as I celebrate my 25th ordination anniversary is simply gratitude. I'm thankful for all the people who've been a part of my story and who've shaped me into who I am today. I'm grateful for the congregations I've served, who've partnered with me on this journey. And I'm thankful to God, the one who created me and called me and continues to walk with me. It's been a wild and fulfilling ride. Let's keep going!

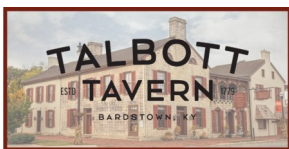


TIME TO REGISTER FOR CAMP WAKON' DA-HO!

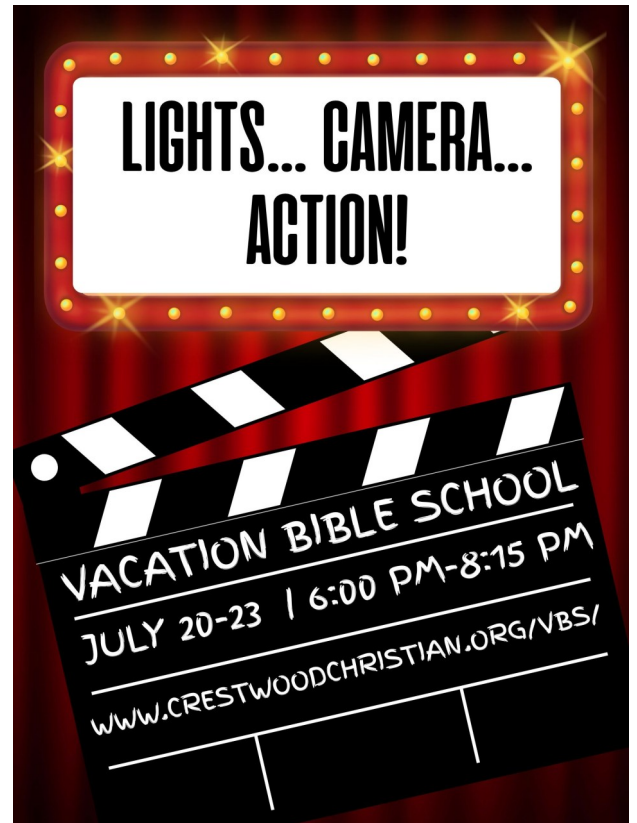

YOUTH CORNER

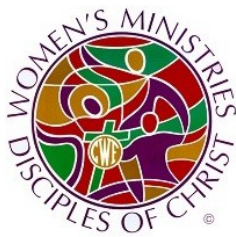
