## A WORD FROM KORY



It's not easy being a church these days. It seems like forces are working against us from all sides. Charitable giving is down, especially to religious organizations. Overall, the church is graying, with fewer young people and families making spiritual life a priority. Attendance on Sunday morning is no longer a given, with

sports and entertainment options encroaching on that sacred time. The dominant view of Christianity in America is tied to Christian nationalism. And here in Lexington, our church community was sullied by the viral video of the church VBS involving fake guns and the "murder" of a Satan-like figure.

And yet...Crestwood continues to thrive. I want to stop a moment and celebrate all that God is doing through our congregation. In many ways, we are bucking the trend and continuing to serve Christ in vibrant, life-changing ways. A perfect example of this is Vacation Bible School, which saw about 90 kids and just as many volunteers come together to sing, play, laugh, and learn about God's love. And no Satan-like figures were harmed! It was truly a glorious week.

That's only one example of how God's spirit is moving through Crestwood. Our SRO group is enjoying trips around the state. Our Prime of Lifers group has several fellowship events coming up. We're in the process of discerning the decision to become both Open and Affirming and a Silver Chalice congregation. We have lively Sunday school classes and Bible studies. And we're gearing up for the return of fall programming and all the joy that brings. Crestwood, we have a lot to celebrate!

In my mind, what's even more powerful is the impact we're having on the community. I marvel every time I come to church and see the parking lot full of cars as people use our building for a variety of community-focused events. Last week, the Local Outreach and Endowment teams met in the newly dedicated Crestwood Community Kitchen at the Nest, a beautiful renovation paid for by one of our Endowment grants. Our name is known in the community as a place of welcome, of compassion, of service in Christ's name.

We have a laundry list of what we do, but I want to encourage you to remember why we do it. It would be easy for us to fall into simply checking off boxes on our spiritual to-do lists or to pat ourselves on the back because

we gave away money or opened our doors to outsiders. But there's a deeper reason why we engage in all of these activities, from Sunday worship to youth groups to Bible study service projects.

It's one of the ways we say "Thank you" to God. God has blessed us in so many ways, way more than we can even imagine. It's so easy for us to take that for granted as we get caught up in complex emotions of life today, from frustration at the demands placed upon us to loneliness from the isolation we feel. And yet, in the midst of all of it, God is good.

So, as we move into fall, I want to encourage you to adopt, as Missy said during VBS, an "attitude of gratitude." That starts with prayer, taking time to talk to God and express thanksgiving for all God has done and is doing. It's amazing to me how a few minutes a day of prayer can fundamentally shift my outlook on everything else that happens. To be clear, God doesn't need us to be grateful, but we need to say "Thank you" as a way of acknowledging God's goodness to us.

But our gratitude shouldn't only come from our mouths. It should also come from our actions, our behaviors, our choices. Attending worship each Sunday is a "thank you" to God for the opportunity to gather for praise and community. Encouraging our children and youth to participate in church activities is a "thank you" for the gift and responsibility of raising them. Coming to a Bible study or Sunday school class is a "thank you" for the ability to learn and grow in faith. And your generosity in giving is a "thank you" to God for the material blessings you have.

Crestwood, I want to encourage you to say "thank you" with your mouth, your hands, your feet, and your heart. Pause for a moment and take inventory of all the good things you enjoy, even in the midst of whatever challenges you face. God is SO good! Every day, let us celebrate and give thanks.

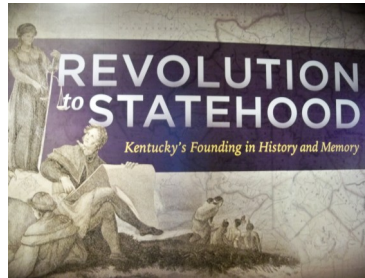

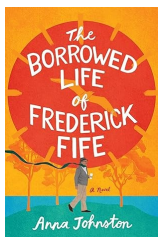

## OPEN AND AFFIRMING SURVEY RESULTS

In our Faithful Plan, approved last August, one of the initiatives was for Crestwood to become “intentionally inclusive.” As a part of that work, a task force was formed to help us explore the possibility of becoming Open and Affirming. This designation communicates to everyone that Crestwood is fully welcoming and accepting of members of the LGBTQ+ community.

To start its work, the task force sent out an exploratory survey for the month of June to see how people felt about this issue. The question asked as, “If we were to vote today to become Open and Affirming, how would you vote?” We received 97 responses; here are the results:

- 76 – 78.4% - Yes, wholeheartedly
- 8 – 8.2% - No, I would not support this
- 6 – 6.2% - Yes, but I would appreciate more education
- 6 – 6.2% I’m not sure how I would vote
- 1 – 1% - yes, but I would appreciate more scriptural engagement

Here’s a sampling of the 34 comments received:

- This is one of the reasons I have started attending this church. I have friends and family that are LGBTQ and several have been pushed away from Christ by closed minded churches.
- I have a daughter that is part of this community. While I can’t say I truly understand it, but it is so hurtful to think of many people rejecting them or being prejudiced against them just because of who they are!
- This action is not necessary because this group is already included in the life of our congregation.
- The focus of the church should be leading people to Jesus not sexuality.
- We should welcome all people, including those who want to exclude others.

The next steps for the Task Force will be to offer some educational opportunities around this issue. Stay tuned for more details. We appreciate your prayers as we continue to discern how Crestwood can be “intentionally inclusive” to all of God’s children.
