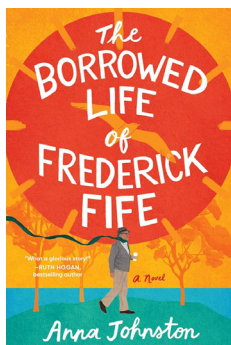
SRO SEPTEMBER TRIP TO TOYOTA
