A WORD FROM KORY



It's been a year since our Administrative Board voted to accept the final report of the Faithful Planning Team. In that report, the team refined our mission statement, articulated a set of six core values for our congregation, and suggested four strategies for helping us live out the plan. It's time to check in. A year later, how are we doing, Crestwood?

I believe we are living out our new mission statement in powerful ways. The statement says our mission is, "Connecting people to God and each other by welcoming and accepting everyone; helping them grow in their faith; and empowering them to serve God by serving others." I see evidence every day of people finding a church home at Crestwood, of taking steps to deepen their faith in Christ, and boldly using their gifts to serve others. It's so inspiring to me to see how our congregation is living this mission!

Similarly, I see our core values woven into the fabric of how we are living and serving. Those values are Welcoming, Authenticity, Generosity, Engagement, Curiosity and Commitment to Outreach. While there is room to grow in each of them, I'm proud of this congregation for seeking to be the people God has called us to be in this place and time. I pray these values continue to guide us as we follow God's leading into the future.

The rubber really meets the road with our four strategies. Each strategy came with suggestions of how we might live them out. The staff has served as the Implementation Team, discerning how each strategy fits into our congregational life. Here are a few of the ways we've put these strategies into practice:

• **Internal Engagement** - *Grow and strengthen the congregation by helping members find personally meaningful ways to minister to one another* - We are working to implement the recommendations from our youth ministry consultants and have hired a new Youth Ministry Director. In addition, our Young Adult and Prime of Lifers groups continue to meet and grow in their relationships and service. We are in the process of connecting new members with Elders who can mentor them as they connect to Crestwood, and I'm offering Crestwood Crash Courses to help people learn more about us.

• **External Engagement** - *Expand our impact on the community and the world by engaging more members in outreach efforts* - Our Local Outreach Team has set up liaisons with our ministry partners in the community. It has

also sponsored a Week of Service in May with another one coming at the end of September. We've also restructured how we fund our Lexington Theological Seminary scholarship so more funds can be directed to local and world outreach.

• **Telling our Story** - *Improve the ways we communicate with both members and non-members about Crestwood's ministry* - We conducted a Communications Survey to determine the best way to get information to the congregation and are working to act on those results. We're in the process of updating and redesigning our website to make it more helpful and user-friendly. Our Technology Team is working to upgrade our live-stream experience, adding words and graphics to the stream. And our Office Administrator, Jennifer, now has the additional responsibility of being our Communications Director.

• **Be Intentionally Inclusive** - *Follow Christ's example by showing God's limitless love to all* - We are working on fulfilling the requirements to become a Silver Chalice congregation, which would increase our ministry to older adults, and to be known as a Dementia-Friendly congregation. In addition, our Open and Affirming Task Force has conducted an exploratory survey and will be offering several educational opportunities this fall.

As you can see, we're working hard to put into place the plans that you, the congregation, helped us articulate. Through the leading of the Holy Spirit, I believe Crestwood will continue to faithfully live out its call to be a shining light in our community and beyond. Thank you for being part of this amazing work!

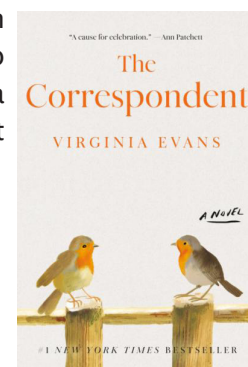
Kory has been approached by an adult in the congregation who is interested in being baptized, so he'd like to know if there are others who are interested as well.

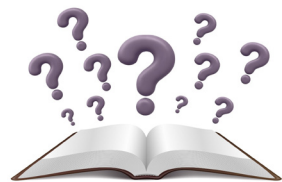

I knew there was no meat in the box and was getting ready to go outside with some cans of tuna and Vienna sausages in my hands, so I went out and asked her if she needed any of those. She took a can of Vienna sausages and the little girl in the backseat smiled and reached for it as soon as she got back to the car with it.

The mom told me she hopes we realize what a Godsend this Blessing Box is. She said her husband had been laid off and her four year-old granddaughter had come to live with them, so even with her working part-time it was almost impossible to pay all their bills these days. She said they were lucky that she has her job and they are not starving, but the Blessing Box really helps fill in the gaps sometimes when they just can't stretch the money far enough."

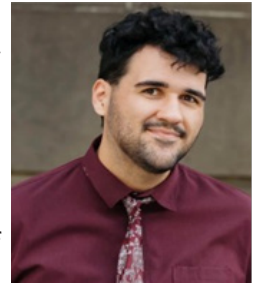
